#### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under sections 209 and 212 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise:

1. the stopping up of that length of highway described in Schedule 1 to this notice to enable development to be

carried out in accordance with a planning permission granted under Part III of that Act; and

2. the extinguishment of any rights which persons may have to use vehicles on those lengths of the highway described in Schedule 2 to this notice.

In connection with "2" above, the proposed Order will contain provisions from permitting the use of those highways by vehicles being used:

- (a) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties if that vehicle cannot be conveniently used for such purpose in any other road; or
- (b) in accordance with a special authorisation for that use given by or on behalf of the County Council of Gwent, the Borough Council of Torfaen or the Chief Officer of Police for the Gwent Constabulary.

During 28 days from the 7th March 1975, copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the Borough of Torfaen Sub Office, Council Offices, Blaenavon and may be obtained, free of charge, from the Secretary of State (quoting the reference number WR15/35/3) at the address stated below.

Within the above-mentioned period of 28 days, any person may, by notice to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Roads Division (Y Swyddfa Gymreig, Adran Ffyrdd), Graham Buildings, 139 Newport Road, Cardiff CF2 1YU (quoting the reference number WR15/35/3), object to the making of the Order.

#### SCHEDULE 1

The highway to be stopped up is at Blaenavon in the Borough of Torfaen. It is shown by zebra hatching on the deposited plan and is that length of the north-western side of Cross Street which extends from its junction with Duke Street to its junction with Hill Street; a distance of approximately 18 yards.
