AYLESBURY VALE DISTRICT COUNCIL

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATHS ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971—SECTION 210

Aylesbury Vale District Council, Aylesbury Vale (Footpaths Nos. 4 and 5 Parish of Akeley) Public Paths Diversion Order, 1975.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 1st day of April 1975, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment or to be confirmed by the Aylesbury Vale District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert the public rights of way as described in the Schedule to this notice. The alternative route will commence from a point opposite the existing public footpath sign and the properties known as Coronation Cottages in the western corner of Field No. O.S. Part 101, thence in a south-easterly direction in a straight line for a distance of 45 metres to the north-eastern boundary of the property known as the Old Greyhound. From this point the new footpath will run in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 35 metres to its junction with the existing footpath No. 4 which abuts the south-eastern boundary of the property known as Sundowner in Main Street, Akeley. With a minimum width throughout of 1 metre.

A copy of the Order and the plan contained in it has been deposited at the Aylesbury Vale District Council Offices, The Mall, Friars Square, Aylesbury, and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the undersigned by the 23rd May 1975, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Aylesbury Vale District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations or objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

Description of Site of Existing Paths

Footpath No. 4. Commencing from a point opposite the existing footpath sign in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 60 metres to its junction with the existing footpath. With a minimum width throughout of 1 metre.

Footpath No. 5. Commencing from a point opposite the existing footpath sign then in a north-north-easterly direction for a distance of 50 metres to its junction with the existing footpath. With a minimum width throughout of 1 metre.

BIRMINGHAM DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Birmingham (Morningside, off Tudor Hill, Sutton Coldfield) Public Path Diversion Order, 1974

Notice is hereby given that on the 6th March 1975, the City of Birmingham District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running from the east side of Tudor Hill, Sutton Coldfield in the City of Birmingham to the south of Number 42 Tudor Hill aforesaid and continuing therefrom in a south-easterly direction to a point at the rear of Number 26 Tudor Hill aforesaid to a line running from the junction of Tudor Hill aforesaid and the western end of the new cul-de-sac road known as Morningside, Sutton Coldfield aforesaid, and continuing therefrom in an easterly direction along the footway alongside the said road Morningside to a point at the rear of Number 5 Richmond

Road, Sutton Coldfield aforesaid and then continuing in a south-westerly direction to the said point at the rear of Number 26 Tudor Hill aforesaid.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Divisional Surveyor's Office, the City of Birmingham District Council, "Oakhurst", Anchorage Road, Sutton Coldfield aforesaid, and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 5.15 p.m. on Mondays to Thursdays inclusive and from 8.45 a.m. to 4.15 p.m. on Fridays.

This Order becomes operative as from the date hereof but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks of the date hereof make application for the purpose to the High Court.

WEST GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971—SECTION 210

The County of West Glamorgan (Community of Cilybebyll —Footpath No. 28) Public Path Diversion Order, 1975

Notice is hereby given that on the 27th March 1975 the Council of the County of West Glamorgan confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running across land situate in the community of Cilybebyll and more particularly described in the Schedule annexed hereto.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the Clerk to the Lliw Valley District Council, Council Offices, West Street, Gorseinon, and may be inspected, free of charge, during normal office hours. These documents are available for inspection during normal office hours at the County Clerk's Department, West Glamorgan County Council, The Guildhall, Swansea.

This Order becomes operative as from 28th March 1975, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, within 6 weeks from Friday, 18th April 1975, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

SCHEDULE

PART 1

Description of Site of Existing Path or Way

The highway to be diverted is in the community of Cilybebyll, namely:

from a point 63 metres (70 yards) east of its termination on Plas Road, Rhos, in an easterly direction to a point 127 metres (140 yards) west of Plas-y-Waun, a distance of 36 metres (40 yards) or thereabouts, shown on the deposited plan in a bold black line between the points a—b.

PART 2

Description of Site of Alternative Highway

A 6 foot 6 inch wide footpath from a point 63 metres (70 yards) east of the termination of footpath No. 28 on Plas Road, in a south-easterly and north-easterly directions and then a 3 foot wide footpath in a north-easterly
