That a Publick Fast be observed throughout that Part of our Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotlard, upon Wednesday the Tuenty ninth of March next ensuing the Date of this our Reyal Proclamation, that so both we and our People may humble our selves before Almighty Sod, in order to obtain Pardon for our Sins, and may, in most devout and solemn manner, send up our Prayers and Supplications to the droine singify, for implaning the Continuance of his Blessing and Afficance on the Arms of w. and our Allies, and our and

Our Will is therefore, and we charge, That incontinent, this our Proclamation seen, ye pass to the Market-Cross of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance. And our Will and Pleasure is, That sur Sollicitor do cause printed Copies hereof to be sent to the Sherist of the several Skiyes, Stewarts of Stewartries, and Baillies of Regalities, and their Cirks, whom we ordain to see the same published: And we appoint them to send Doubles hereof to the several Paroch-Kirks within their Bounds, That upon the Lord's Day immediately preceding the Day above memoined, the same may be published and read from the Pairs immediately after Divine Service.

Hereas we have been informed, That great Numbers of Seamen and Mariners belinging to our Ships of War, have absented themselves from their Duty, contrary to the Discipline of the Navy, and to the great prejudice and delay of our Service, and thereby incurred great Penalties, which in strictness might be insticted upon them: But it being our Desire that our Navy be fit out to Sea with all the Expedition that is possible; we do hereby Charge and Command all Seamen and Mariners, who have absented as aforesaid, to repair to their respective Ships by the twenty third Day of March next ensuing. And we do hereby declare, That as we are defirous to give all due Encouragement to fuch Seamen and Mariners employed in our Service, as shall be found doing their Duty in their several Stations and Employments, so severally of we are resolved to proceed with the utmost Severity of Law, against all such who shall disobey this our Royal Proclamation; and therefore we are hereby graciously pleased to declare, That such Seamen who have absented themselves from any of our Ships, and shall render themselves on Board the same, or any other of our Ships of War, or Tenders, on Notice of this our Proclamation, according to our Commands berein, shall not be Prosecuted for such their absenting our Service, in order to inflict any corporal Punishment on them: But that all such Deserters who shall not, before the said Three and twentieth Day of March, render themselves on Board some of our Ships of War, or who shall hereaster abproper Officers. Shall be Prosecuted at a Court-Marrial with the utmost Severity, and being found Guilty of Deferting, at this time when their Country so much wants their Service, they shall be deemed unworthy of our Rojal Mercy, and shall suffer according to Law.

Hague, February 28. N. S. Frequent Conferences have lately been held by the Ministers of the several Potentiates of the Alliance concerning the Affairs of the North, and hothing hath been omitted which may tend to the Prefervation of the Tranquility of the Empire.
