WYRE FOREST DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Wyre Forest District Council (Parking Places) (Number 1) Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that the Wyre Forest District Council on the 1st May 1975 with the consent of the Hereford and Worcester County Council made an Order under sections 28, 31 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and checkly 10. schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, for the purposes of regulating all multi-storey car parks and surface area car parks within their district.

The general effect of the Order is to make provisions as to the use of the parking places referred to, the classes of vehicles entitled to use them, the condition on which they may be used, the charges therefor, and the removal therefrom of vehicles left in the said parking places in contra-

vention of the Order.

The Order contains (inter alia) the following provisions:

1. Days and times on which the parking places will be available:

The parking places will be open from 00.01 hours to 24.00 hours, in respect of the multi-storey car parks from Monday to Saturday and in respect of the surface area car parks from Sunday to Saturday (all days inclusive).

2. Classes of vehicles for which the parking places will be available:

(i) All parking places: Any vehicle licensed as private motor car, land rover, light trading van not exceeding 30 cwt. and being less than 6 feet 6 inches in height.

(ii) Dog Lane, Bewdley; Severn Meadow No. 2, and Vale Road West, Stourport-on-Severn; and on market days only but then only for market purposes, Hoo Road, Kidderminster:

Heavy goods vehicles, buses and coaches. (iii) Load Street, Bewdley; Batemans, Kidderminster::

Motor cycles and motor scooters.

3. Charges for the use of the parking places described in Part I of the Schedule to this notice are as follows:

(i) Multi-Storey: 5p per hour between 08.00 hours and 18.30 hours daily and in addition but in respect of Swan Centre on Fridays only 18.30 hours to 20.30 hours.

(ii) Surface area:

(a) In respect of private motor cars, land rovers and light trade vans between the hours of 08.00 hours and 18.30 hours 5p per hour to a maximum of 4 hours (i.e. 20p) and thereafter no further charge for the remaining part of that day.

(b) In respect of heavy goods vehicles, buses and coaches between the hours of 08.00 hours and 18.30 hours 15p per hour to a maximum of 4 hours (i.e. 60p) and thereafter no further charge for the remaining part of that day. PROVIDED that no charge will be payable in respect of a heavy goods vehicle waiting for a period not exceeding 12 hours in any period of twenty-four hours.

(c) In respect of non-payment of charges specified or in respect of vehicles waiting in a parking place after the period for which payment has been made has expired an excess charge of £1 will be

payable. Season or Period Tickets are available for parking places as follows:

(i) Multi-Storey Season ticket at a cost of £50.

(ii) Season ticket at a cost of £25. Period ticket (per calendar month) at a cost of £2.10.

Exemption:

(i) All parking places; An exemption is included in the Order in respect of invalid carriages; vehicles
