- (d) Vehicles requiring access for essential loading and unloading purposes which as a general rule will only be allowed between the hours of 4 p.m. and 10 a.m.

Special provision will also be made in spaces designated for the parking of invalid carriages and vehicles displaying disabled persons badges immediately adjacent to the precinct.

The Order will come into effect on 18th May 1975.
