The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish the following lengths of footpath:

- (a) footpath DHU 13 in the Parish of Huntley from its junction with Frog Lane at grid reference SO 72381965 extending north-north-eastwards for 170 feet and north-north-westwards for 200 feet;
- (b) footpath DHU 15 from its junction with footpath DHU 13 (at a point 170 feet north-north-eastwards of the junction of footpath DHU 13 with Frog Lane) extending eastwards for 110 feet north-north-eastwards for 370 feet and northwards for 180 feet.

An alternative highway in lieu will be created over a 4 feet wide strip of land from the junction of footpath DHU 13 with Frog Lane extending along Frog Lane in a north-north-westerly direction for 350 feet and thereafter north-eastwards for 90 feet eastwards for 250 feet north-eastwards for 330 feet and north-north-westwards for 80 feet to its junction with footpath DHU 15.

A copy of the Order and map contained in it has been deposited at the Forest of Dean District Council Offices, Belle Vue Road, Cinderford and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 4 p.m., Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the County Clerk, Gloucestershire County Council, Shire Hall, Gloucester not later than the 3rd May 1975, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Gloucestershire County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

GREENWICH LONDON BOROUGH COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971

Extensions to West Greenwich Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Greenwich, by resolution dated 12th February 1975 and in accordance with section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, designated the land described in the Schedule hereto as extensions to the existing West Greenwich Conservation Area.

A plan showing the areas of land comprised in the extensions and entitled "West Greenwich Conservation Area—proposed extensions", may be inspected by members of the public at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Borough Planning Officer, 45-53 Wellington Street, Woolwich, London S.E.18.

The effect of such designation is that it will now be necessary to obtain the Council's consent to the demolition of any building in the Conservation Area, with the exception of listed buildings, ecclesiastical buildings, ancient monuments and buildings which are exempted by direction of the Secretary of State for the Environment.

SCHEDULE

Thames Street. Following along the back of pavement on the southern boundary of Thames Street and extending from a point immediately outside No. 52 Greenwich Church Street to a position in alignment with the back of pavement on the western side of Wood Wharf.

Wood Wharf. Following along the back of pavement on the western boundary of Wood Wharf and extending to a point in mid-stream of the River Thames.

River Thames. Following along the mid-stream line of the River Thames opposite Wood Wharf and extending eastwards until it intersects with the western boundary of Conservation Area No. 1 which is in alignment with the eastern flank of the "Cutty Sark" berth.

King William Walk. Following along the western boundary of Conservation Area No. 1 to a point of intersection with the frontage of No. 43 King William Walk then westwards following the northern boundary of the "Gipsy Moth" public house, then southwards along the back of pavement of Greenwich Church Street on its eastern side

and terminating outside No. 52, the starting point of the proposed Conservation Area extension.

Bardsley Lane. Extending eastwards from the back boundary of Nos. 1 to 16 Sexton's House (B.M. 17.02) along back of pavement to a point of intersection with the western boundary of Conservation Area No. 1 then southwards across St. Alfege Recreation Ground.

St. Alfege Recreation Ground. From the western boundary of Conservation Area No. 1 along the southern boundary of the Recreation Ground until it intersects with the back boundary of Sexton's House, then northwards until the starting point in Bardsley Lane is reached.

Public Path Diversion Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that the above named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 23rd April 1975 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the South Herefordshire District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed with modification, will be to divert part of the footpath LU10 in the Parish of Lugwardine from a point approximately 27 yards north-north-east of the Unclassified County Road No. 569 and known as Cotts Lane and running in a north-north-easterly and northerly direction for a distance of approximately 110 yards to a line running from the said point approximately 27 yards north-north-east of Cotts Lane, in a north-north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 44 yards and in a westerly and northerly direction for a distance of approximately 80 yards, then in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 20 yards.

Field 592 for a distance of approximately 94 yards to a line running from the said point approximately 40 yards south of the Class III Road C224 in a south-westerly, southerly and easterly direction for a distance of approximately 117 yards.
