The Kirklees (Moor End Road, Lockwood) Footpath Diversion Order, 1975

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 28th April 1975 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Kirklees Metropolitan Council as an unopposed Order.

Designation of Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth in pursuance of their powers under section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, as amended by section 1 of the Town and Country Amenities Act, 1974, have designated certain land falling within the boundaries provided by Gipsy Hill, Woodland Road, Westow Hill, Highland Road, Lunham Road, Hawke Road, Victoria Crescent, Sainsbury Road and Charters Close, as a conservation area known as Conservation Area No. 14.
