

The Direction made in pursuance of the provisions of paragraph 3 (b) of the said Article 4 and its effect is to take away:

- (1) the right to erect gates, fences, walls and other means of enclosure, the formation, laying out and construction of a means of access to a highway; and
- (2) the use of the land for any purpose, or purposes, if not more than 28 days in total in any calendar year and the erection or placing of movable structures on the land for the purposes of that use.

The Direction shall remain in force for six months from the date on which it was made and shall then expire unless it has before the termination of the said six months been approved by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

The land is in two parts comprising 152 acres or thereabouts situated in the District of Allerdale in the County of Cumbria approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile and $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles east of the village of Broughton Moor, south of the Broughton Moor—Linefoot Road C.337 and is contiguous with the eastern and western boundaries of the existing Low Close Opencast Coal site. The western part of the land lies east of Fox House Farm and includes a section of the Broughton Moor—Little Broughton Road U.2170. The eastern part of the land lies south-west of Linefoot and includes a section of the Linefoot—Little Broughton Road U.2171.

Public Path Extinguishment Order 1975

Public Path Diversion Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 28th day of April 1975 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order, by the South Yorkshire County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public right of way over a length of footpath number 2 at Braithwell in the Metropolitan Borough of Doncaster extending for a distance of 116 yards approximately in a south-easterly direction from its junction with Holywell Lane to a line commencing on Holywell Lane at a point 63 yards approximately south of the point where the existing path joins Holywell Lane and extending for a distance of 105 yards approximately in an easterly direction until it rejoins the existing path.
