DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SECURITY

MEDICINES ACT 1968

European Pharmacopoeia

On behalf of the Secretaries of State respectively concerned with health in England, in Scotland and in Wales and on behalf of the Head of the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, it is hereby declared under section 65 (7) of the Medicines Act 1968, that on and after 1st July 1975 the following amendments to the volume of the European Pharmacopoeia published in 1971 (Volume II), under the direction of the Council of Europe (Partial Agreement) in accordance with the Convention on the Elaboration of a European Pharmacopoeia, are to have effect for the purposes of section 65 of that Act.

Vaccinum Influenzae Adsorbatum

Volume II, page 404. Replace the first paragraph by the following:

"Influenza Vaccine (Adsorbed) is a sterile aqueous suspension of inactivated influenza virus to which aluminium hydroxide, aluminium oxide, aluminium phosphate or calcium phosphate has been added. These adjuvants are precipitated in special conditions which confer the appropriate physical form and adsorptive properties."

Vaccinum Typhoidi

Volume II, page 421. Replace the first paragraph by the following:

"Typhoid Vaccine is a suspension of killed *Salmonella typhi* containing not less than 500 million and not more than 1,000 million bacteria (*S. typhi*) per human dose, the human dose being contained in not more than 1.0 ml of the vaccine."

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971 AND HIGHWAYS ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for the Environment hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 211 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 and section 3 of the Highways Act 1971 entitled "The Porlock-Minehead (A.39) (Improvement from Brandish Street to Buddle Hill, Selworthy) Scheme (Stopping Up) Order 1975" authorising the stopping up of a length of the Porlock-Minehead Road (A.39) and requiring the provision of a new highway maintainable at the public expense for which the highway authority is to be the Somerset County Council.

The Order also authorises the stopping up of private means of access to premises and the provision of new means of access to premises.

Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Department of the Environment, at the Office of the Regional Controller (Roads and Transportation), South West Region, Froomsgate House, Rupert Street, Bristol, BS1 2QN (quoting DSW/507335/1/010) and may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the West Somerset District Council, 20 Fore Street, Williton, Somerset.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Acts or that any requirement of those Acts or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the 30th May 1975 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for the Environment hereby gives notice that on the application of the Cotswold District Council, he proposes to make an Order under section 212 of the above Act to provide for the extinguishment of any right which persons may have to use vehicles on part of St. Michael's Road and Sperringate, Cirencester.

The proposed Order will contain provisions for permitting the use of those highways by vehicles being used:

- For police, ambulance or fire brigade purposes;
- On behalf of a statutory undertaker or the Post Office and engaged upon the laying, erection, inspection, maintenance, alteration, repair, renewal or removal of any main, pipe, conduit, wire, cable or other apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878, under, in, on, over, along or across the highways of any land adjacent to the highways.

During 28 days from the 30th May 1975, copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at the Council Offices, 5 Dyer Street, Cirencester, Glos., and may be obtained free of charge from the Secretary of State (quoting DSW/505635/1/09) at the address stated below.

Within the above-mentioned period of 28 days, any person may, by notice to the Secretary of State (ref. DSW/505635/1/09) at his address at the Office of the Regional Controller (Roads and Transportation), South West Region, Froomsgate House, Rupert Street, Bristol, BS1 2QN, object to the making of the Order.
