

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert part of the public footpath (Path No. 35) in the Parish of West Itchenor, by stopping up the path commencing at its junction with the public footpath (Path No. 36) extending north-eastwards for a distance of approximately 160 feet thence eastwards for a distance of approximately 410 feet, and substitute for that path a new length of public footpath, a minimum width of 6 feet commencing at the southern end of the length of path to be stopped up, extending eastwards for a distance of approximately 470 feet, thence northwards for a distance of approximately 180 feet to join the eastern end of the length of path to be stopped up.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Office of the County Secretary, County Hall, Chichester, between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the County Secretary, County Hall, Chichester, Sussex and should be received on or before 4th July 1975, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn the West Sussex County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

*West Sussex County Council (Ardingly) Public Path
(No. 7) Diversion Order, 1975*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 16th May 1975 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order, by the West Sussex County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert part of the public footpath (Path No. 7) in the Parish of Ardingly, by stopping up the path commencing at its junction with the maintainable highway (B.2028), extending south-westwards for a distance of approximately 1,180 feet, crossing the showground of the South of England Agricultural Society, and substituting for that path a new length of public footpath, a minimum width of 6 feet, commencing at a point on the maintainable highway (B.2028) at a point approximately 130 feet south-east of its original junction, extending south-westwards for a distance of approximately 650 feet, thence westwards for a distance of approximately 570 feet to join the south-western end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up.

(No. 403) Diversion Order, 1972*

Notice is hereby given, that on 16th May 1975 the West Sussex County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert part of the public footpath (Path No. 403) in the Parish of Slindon, by stopping up the path commencing at the northern end of Oakfield at a point approximately 1,640 feet north-east of Downe's Barn, extending southwards for a distance of approximately 240 feet, thence westwards for a distance of approximately 70 feet to a point on the northern end of Baycombe Wood, and substituting for that path a new length of public footpath, a minimum width of 6 feet, commencing at the western end of the length of path proposed to be stopped up extending northwards for a distance of approximately 190 feet to join the diverted route of the public footpath (Path No. 404).

The Order becomes operative as from 27th June 1975, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 6th June 1975, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

(No. 2456) Diversion Order, 1975*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 4th April 1975 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the West Sussex County Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert part of the public footpath (Path No. 2456) in the Parish of Parham, by stopping up the path commencing at its junction with the maintainable highway (Coldwaltham-Greatham Road) extending southwards for a distance of approximately 600 feet, thence south-eastwards for a distance of approximately 730 feet, thence generally southwards for a distance of approximately 2,100 feet to the east of Quell Farm, thence south-westwards for a distance of approximately 1,900 feet and substitute for that path, a new length of public footpath, a minimum width of 6 feet, commencing at the northern end of the length of path to be stopped up, extending south-westwards for a distance of approximately 100 feet to the eastern bank of the River Arun, thence generally southwards along the eastern bank of the River Arun for a distance of approximately 750 feet, thence generally southwards for a distance of approximately 300 feet, thence generally south-westwards for a distance of approximately 1,100 feet, thence generally south-eastwards for a distance of approximately 800 feet, thence generally southwards for a distance of approximately 130 feet, thence south-eastwards for a distance of approximately 130 feet, thence south-westwards for a distance of approximately 450 feet, thence south-eastwards for a distance of approximately 300 feet all on a farm access road to join the southern end of the length of path to be stopped up.
