

SECTION VII

Service Attributable Retired Pay for Permanent or Pensionable Officers of Flag and General Rank and the Chaplain of the Fleet who are attributably invalidated on or after 1st January 1975

8. The provisions of this Section relate to Officers of Flag and General Rank of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines and the Chaplain of the Fleet who are attributably invalidated on or after 1st January 1975 with an attributable disability assessed at 20 per cent. or more, and who, subject to the general conditions of award laid down in Orders in Council current at the time of the officer's invaliding from the Service, may be awarded service attributable retired pay at the following minimum rates:

SECTION VIII

Gratuities for Officers of Flag and General Rank and the Chaplain of the Fleet attributably invalidated on or after 1st January 1975

9. (a) Officers of Flag and General Rank of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines and the Chaplain of the Fleet who are awarded service attributable retired pay under Section VII of this Schedule may be awarded the terminal grant for which they would have been eligible on non-attributable invaliding,

(b) a further gratuity at the rates shown below if their degree of disability is 20 per cent. or more.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas it is expedient to provide for revised rates of service retired pay, service invaliding retired pay, service attributable retired pay and gratuities for Officers of Flag and General Rank of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines and the Chaplain of the Fleet:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865, and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pensions) (Officers of Flag and General Rank) (No. 1) Order 1975.

Interpretation

2. The Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

General

3. The revised rates take into account the threshold agreement whereby Naval personnel are in receipt of weekly and monthly additions to pay.

4. The revised rates of service retired pay, service invaliding retired pay, service attributable retired pay and gratuities shall be as specified in the Schedule hereto.

5. The provisions contained in this Order shall have effect from 1st January 1974.

SCHEDULE

SECTION I

Half Pay and Terminal Grants for Admirals of the Fleet

1. (a) An Admiral of the Fleet will be eligible during periods subsequent to 31st December 1973, for which he does not receive full pay, for half pay at the rate of £8,216 per annum.

(b) An Admiral of the Fleet granted half pay and whose last day of service on full pay is 1st January 1974, or later, may be awarded a tax-free terminal grant of £24,648, in addition to his half pay.

2. An Admiral of the Fleet who has been awarded a terminal grant under this Schedule shall not be eligible for any further terminal grant on the conclusion of any subsequent period of full pay service.

SECTION II

Service Retired Pay For Permanent or Pensionable Officers of Flag and General Rank of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines, and the Chaplain of the Fleet, who Retire on or after 1st January 1974

3. The provisions of this Section relate to Officers of Flag and General Rank of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines and the Chaplain of the Fleet who retire from the Active List on or after 1st January 1974 and who, subject to the general conditions
