## THE COUNTY OF DURHAM

(The Borough of Darlington) (Kendrew Street/Holly Street) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that the Durham County Council (hereinafter called "the Council") propose to make an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 the effect. of which will be to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on:

1. Holly Street

2. Kendrew Street-the east and north sides from a point 4 yards north of the south-west corner of the Public Baths to the eastern end of the street.

The west and south sides from the northern side of the car park entrance southwards and eastwards to the end

of the street.

Exceptions will be made in the Order for vehicles to wait for so long as may be necessary:-

1. To enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle.

2. To enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from

the vehicle.

- 3. To enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road, or the sides of roads so referred to or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said road, the said sides or roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878.
- 4. To enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
- 5. To enable a disabled person's vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge and a parking disc marked with the time at which the period began in accordance with the provisions of the Order to wait for not more than 2 hours' return prohibited within I hour.

A copy of the proposed Order, a map showing the road and sides of roads to which it relates and a copy of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected at the Borough Secretary and Solicitor's Office, Town Hall, Darlington during normal office hours on Monday to Friday.

If you wish to object to the proposals you must make such objection in writing specifying the grounds thereof to me at the address below by the 1st July 1975.
