The Borough Council of South Ribble (Various Roads, Leyland) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting and Driving) Order, 1975.

Notice is hereby given that the South Ribble Borough Council, acting under agency arrangements with the Lancashire County Council, propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be to:

- (1) Prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on any day other than a Sunday in the length of road specified in the First Schedule to this notice.
- (2) Prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time in the lengths of road specified in the Second Schedule to this notice.
- (3) Prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday in the length of road specified in the Third Schedule to this notice:

The Order in so far as it relates to Derby Street, Worden Lane, Thurston Road and King Street will contain provisions for revoking the existing regulations affecting parts of these four roads.
