Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council on 6th June 1975 made the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6, 35 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974.

2. The effect of the Islington (Prescribed Routes) (No. 1) Traffic Order 1975 will be:

A. To revoke:

(a) the one-way working for vehicular traffic in:
 (i) Cloudesley Road, between Batchelor Street and Dewey Road, from north-west to south-east;

(ii) Dewey Road, from north-east to south-west ; (iii) Mantell Street, from north-east to south-west ;

imposed by the Islington (Prescribed Routes) (No. 2) Traffic Order 1970;

- (b) the one-way working for vehicular traffic in:
 (i) Barnsbury Park, from north-east to south-west;
 (ii) Brooksby Street, from south-west to north-east;
 - (iii) Cloudesley Place, from south-west to north-east;
 (iv) Cloudesley Road:

 (1) between Batchelor Street and Cloudesley Place,
 - from south-east to north-west; (2) between Cloudesley Square and Richmond

Avenue, from south to north ;

(3) the carriageway on the south-west side of the island site adjacent to the junctions of Cloudesley Road, Cloudesley Place, Copenhagen Street and Dignum Street, from south-east to north-west; (v) Lofting Road:

(1) between Hemingford Road and Thornhill Road,

from west to east; (2) between Belper Street and Thornhill Road, from east to west; (vi) Thornhill Road:

(1) between Belitha Villas and Offord Road, from south-east to north-west;

(2) between Malvern Terrace and Richmond Avenue, from north-east to south-west;

- imposed by the Islington (Prescribed Routes) (No. 5) Traffic Order 1971;
- (c) the prohibition on vehicles entering or leaving:(i) Barnsbury Road, at its junction with Copenhagen Street;
 - (ii) Bewdley Street, at its junction with Liverpool Road ;
 - imposed by the above-mentioned Order of 1971.
- B. To impose one-way working for vehicular traffic in:
- (i) Barnsbury Park, from south-west to north-east;
 (ii) Cloudesley Road, between Cloudesley Square and Richmond Avenue, from south to north;

(iii) Dewey Road, between Dignum Street and Barnsbury Road, from north-east to south-west;

- (iv) Mantell Street, from south-west to north-east.
- C. To prohibit vehicles from entering or leaving

- (i) Brooksby Street, at its junction with Thornhill Road; (ii) Cloudesley Road, at its junction with Dignum Street; (iii) College Cross, at its junction with Liverpool Road; (iv) Dewley Road, east of its junction with Dignum Street
- at that junction.
- D. To prohibit vehicles proceeding in a southerly direction in Barnsbury Road from turning right into Copenhagen Street.

3. The prohibitions referred to in paragraphs 2 C (i) and

(iii) above will not apply to any vehicle when used in an emergency for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes.
4. The prohibitions referred to in paragraphs 2 B and D

above will not apply to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.
