The Somerset (Footpath No. 18/5 at Chantry) Public Path Diversion Order, 1974

Notice is hereby given that on 18th July 1975, the Mendip District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert that part of Footpath 18/5 at Chantry in the parish of Whatley that runs from the Little Elm to Whatley Class 3 road in a generally northerly direction for a distance of approximately 70 yards, to run from a point on the Little Elm to Whatley Class 3 road approximately 17 yards north-east of its former junction with the Little Elm to Whatley Class 3 road in a generally westerly and then northerly direction for a total distance of approximately 90 yards to rejoin its former route.
