TRAFFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL
TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

Designation of Conservation Areas

Notice is hereby given that Trafford Borough Council has determined that a further two areas of the Borough are of special architectural and historic interest and that such areas should be preserved and enhanced. Accordingly, on 10th July 1975, the above Council designated the following areas as Conservation Areas under section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971:

(1) *The Borough of Trafford (Dunham Woodhouses) Conservation Area*

This area is located on the north bank of the River Bollin and includes the village buildings at the junction of Woodhouse Lane with Barns Lane and Station Road and follows the rear boundaries of these buildings.

(2) *The Borough of Trafford (Warburton Village) Conservation Area*

Part of Warburton which now forms a nucleus in a village that straggles along Bent Lane and Paddock Lane as far as Mossbrow and includes the junction of Paddock Lane, Townfield Lane, Church Green and Bridge Road where the old village cross and stocks are situated.

The effect of such designation is:

- (a) to place a duty on the Borough Council as local planning authority, at such time as the Secretary of State for the Environment may from time to time direct, to formulate and publish proposals for the preservation and enhancement of the Conservation Areas and to submit them for consideration to a local public meeting, and
- (b) to bring the demolition of all buildings in the Conservation Areas under control by applying The Town and Country Planning (Listed Buildings and Buildings in Conservation Areas) (Amendment) Regulations 1974 and anyone wishing to demolish a building in the Areas must first apply for listed building consent to the Borough Council, as the local planning authority.

Copies of maps showing the extent of these Conservation Areas are available at the office of the Chief Planning Officer, Birch House, Talbot Road, Stretford, M16 0GH, where they may be examined on weekdays between 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Further information and application forms for purpose (b) above may also be obtained from the Chief Planning Officer.

Wansdyke District Council (Footpath No. BA 27/30 at Keynsham)

Public Path Diversion Order 1975

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), made on the 24th July 1975, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed by the Wansdyke District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert part of the public right of way (Footpath No. BA 27/30) running from its junction with Teviot Road to a point approximately 48 metres south-east of that junction, to a line (partly along a new pavement to be constructed) commencing from the existing point of junction with Teviot Road and running south and then east-north-east for approximately 68 metres, then crossing Windrush Road and continuing east-north-east for approximately 25

metres and then north-north-west for approximately 20 metres, rejoining the remaining part of Footpath BA 27/30.

A copy of the Order, and the map contained in it, has been deposited at the Town Hall, Keynsham, Bristol, and may be inspected free of charge between the hours 8.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive.

Any representation or objection with respect of the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Wansdyke District Council, Town Hall, Keynsham, Bristol, and should be received on or before 25th August 1975, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Wansdyke District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

The Lancashire County Council (Footpaths Nos. 64 and 65 Golborne) Diversion Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th June 1975, the Wigan Borough Council confirmed the above Order. The effect of the Order as confirmed is:

- (1) To divert the length of Footpath No. 65, running from Wash End, Golborne, in a southerly direction, for some 180 yards to its junction with Footpaths numbered 64, 66 and 68.
- (2) To divert the length of Footpath No. 64, running from its junction with Footpaths numbered 65, 66 and 68, in a south-westerly direction for some 247 yards to its second junction with Footpath No. 68.

The alternative route for these diversions is as follows:

A line commencing at Wash End and running generally south-westerly for some 300 yards, then south-easterly for some 100 yards to re-join the existing footpath system.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at, and may be inspected free of charge at the Office of the Director of Administration, Civic Centre, Millgate, Wigan, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m., on Mondays to Fridays for 6 weeks from the 25th July 1975.

This Order becomes operative as from the 25th July 1975, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971 or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order he may, under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, within 6 weeks from the 25th July 1975, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
