

DUDLEY METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

Town and Country Planning (General Development Orders 1973 and 1974

Notice is hereby given that on 3rd January 1975 the Borough Council of Dudley made a Direction under Article 4 (1) and (3) (b) of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1973 (as amended) (hereinafter called "the Development Order") relating to the Metropolitan Borough of Dudley.

The effect of the said Direction was that, notwithstanding the provisions of Article 3 of the Development Order, development in the Metropolitan Borough of Dudley of the kinds specified in the Schedule hereto might not be carried out unless planning permission therefore was granted on an application in that behalf.

The Direction came into effect on 3rd January 1975 and, by virtue of Article 4 (3) of the Development Order, it was to remain in force for 6 months from the date on which it was made and was then to expire unless it had, before the termination of the said 6 months, been approved by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

The Secretary of State has refused to confirm the Direction and, therefore, it ceased to have effect with effect from 3rd July 1975. Consequently, as from the latter date, development in the Metropolitan Borough of Dudley of the kinds specified in the Schedule hereto are again permitted by Article 3 of the Development Order and may be undertaken without the permission of the Local Planning Authority or of the Secretary of State.

SCHEDULE

The use of land in the Metropolitan Borough of Dudley (other than a building or the curtilage of a building) for the purpose of the holding of markets on not more than fourteen days in total in any calendar year, and the erection or placing of moveable structures on the land for the purposes of that use, being development comprised within Class IV 2 referred to in Schedule 1 to the Development Order and not being development comprised within any other class.

NOTICE OF MAKING OF PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER

COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1968

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

Forest Heath District Council, Barton Mills (No. 3) Public Path Diversion Order 1971

Notice is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 1st August 1975, and if no objections are received, or if any objections received are subsequently withdrawn within the time and in the manner specified below, the Order will be confirmed by the Council in accordance with the statutory procedure.

Its effect will be to divert the length of footpath situate on the east side of a private roadway leading to Bridgemans Row, Barton Mills, and lying on the south side of The Street, Barton Mills, and running in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 65 feet, and then in a westerly direction for a distance of some 25 feet, to a line commencing at approximately 25 feet west of the point where the existing path starts on the south side of The Street aforesaid, and running in a southerly direction for a distance of some 65 feet. The new path thus created will serve as a suitable alternative to the existing path and will run parallel to it.

A copy of the Order, and the map contained in it, has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, King Street, Mildenhall, between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on weekdays other than Saturdays.

Any objection or representation concerning the Order may be sent in writing to the undersigned at Council Offices, King Street, Mildenhall, before the 24th August, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

GREAT YARMOUTH BOROUGH COUNCIL

NOTICE OF PUBLIC FOOTPATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971,
SECTIONS 209 AND 210*The Great Yarmouth Borough Council (Burgh Castle-Footpath No. 3) Public Path Diversion Order 1975*

Notice is hereby given that on 29th July 1975 the Great Yarmouth Borough Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert the public right of way known as Footpath No. 3 from a point to the south of the Old Kiln in a southerly direction over a private roadway serving the boatyard for a distance of approximately 148 linear yards, onto a line running in an easterly direction, and thence in a generally southerly direction, for a total distance of approximately 202 linear yards, along a private roadway, which runs roughly parallel to the existing line of footpath to rejoin Footpath No. 3.

A copy of the confirmed Order, and the map contained thereto, has been deposited at the office of the Secretary, Town Hall, Great Yarmouth, and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

This Order becomes operative as from 1st August 1975, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or any regulation made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may, under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within 6 weeks from 1st August 1975, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

2-40 (even) and 1-29 (odd) Garlies Road; 1-35 (odd) and 2-24 (even) Allenby Road; 143-171 (odd) Woolstone Road; 1-45 (odd) Perry Rise; 68, Priestfield Road; and the Fire Station in Perry Vale.

The provisions of section 61A and 277A of the 1971 Act (restriction on cutting down, topping, lopping, etc. of trees and the demolition of buildings without the consent of the Council) apply to these Conservation Areas.
