Its effect will be to divert the length of footpath situate on the east side of a private roadway leading to Bridgemans Row, Barton Mills and lying on the south side of The Street, Barton Mills, and running in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 65 feet and then in a westerly direction for a distance of some 25 feet to a line commencing at approximately 25 feet west of the point where the existing path starts on the south side of The Street aforesaid and running in a southerly direction for a distance of some 65 feet. The new path thus created will serve as a suitable alternative to the existing path and will run parallel to it.

Pinchbeck Conservation Area
