#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday, the 22nd August 1975, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £350,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Tuesday the 26th August 1975 to Friday the 29th August 1975 inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one new halfpenny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under section 212 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the extinguishment of any rights which persons may have to use vehicles on the lengths of highway described in the Schedule to this notice.

The Order contains provisions for permitting the use of those highways by vehicles being used:

 (a) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties if that vehicle cannot be conveniently used for such purpose in any other road; or

(b) in accordance with the special authorisation for that use given by or on behalf of the County Council of Gwent, the Borough Council or Torfaen or the Chief Officer of Police for the Gwent Constabulary.
