OUNT Zinz ndorf is fet out for Genoa, from whence he defigns to fail to Barcelona. The Imperial Commissaries carnest y sollicit the Princes of Italy, that are Feudatory to the Empire, immediately to advance their Proportions for defraying the Expence of the War. The Duke of Parma hath already paid his Contribution.
