ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967 The Various Trunk Roads (Prohibition of Waiting) (Clearways) (Variation) Order 1975

The Secretary of State for the Environment has made The Secretary of State for the Environment has made an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and (6) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974. The effect of the Order which comes into operation on 1st October 1975, is to extend the existing prohibition on waiting on the main carriageway of the King's Lynn-Sleaford-Newark Trunk Road (A.17) between Leadenham and Holdingham in the County of Lincolnshire to include the main carriageways forming part of the length of the Trunk Road described in the Schedule hereto, and to prohibit waiting by any vehicle for the purpose of trading, unless the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle, or any verge or lay-by adjacent to the said main carriageways.

The prohibition imposed by the Order will not apply:

(a) to a vehicle waiting upon the direction or with the

permission of a police constable in uniform;
(b) so as to prevent a vehicle being used in connenction with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or of any of the services therein;
