TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Wales gives notice that on the application of South Glamorgan County Council he has made an Order under Section 212 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 for extinguishing any rights which persons may have to use vehicles on those lengths of road described in Schedules 1A, 2A and 3 to this Notice.

The Order contains provisions for permitting:

- the use of the highways specified in Schedule 1A by the vehicles specified in Schedule 1B;
- the use of the highways specified in Schedule 2A by the vehicles specified in Schedule 2B.

Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Roads Department (Y Swyddfa Gymreig, Adran Ffyrdd), Graham Buildings, 139 Newport Road, Cardiff (quoting the reference number WR15/7/37), and may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the County Solicitor, Glamorgan County Council, 9th Floor, County Headquarters, Newport Road, Cardiff.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirements of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks of

20th October 1975, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

Any person who, at the time of the coming into force of the Order, has an interest in land having lawful access to the highway to which the Order relates may claim compensation from the South Glamorgan County Council in respect of any depreciation in the value of his interest which is directly attributable to the Order and of any other loss or damage which is so attributable.

SCHEDULES

The highways involved are in the City of Cardiff. (All distances quoted are approximate).

SCHEDULE 1A

- That length of road, known as Queen Street, which extends from the west side of its junction with Park Place in a westerly direction for 366 yards to the east side of its junction with Kingsway but excluding that part of the southern side of Queen Street being 8 yards in width which lies between the west side of its junction with Park Place and the west side of its junction with Charles Street;
- the entire length of the road known as Paradise Place which extends from its junction with Queen Street in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 70 yards;
