The County of Devon (Rowley Road, St. Marychurch, Torquay) (Prohibition of Driving) Order, 1976

Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended.

When the proposed Order comes into effect you will not be allowed to drive any motor vehicle in Rowley Road, St. Marychurch, Torquay from its junction with St. Marychurch Road to a point 90 yards east of its junction with Fore Street.

Exceptions will, however, permit the driving of motor vehicles in the affected length of road:

1. for conveying persons or goods to or from premises adjacent to that length of road;
2. in connection with building operations, road repairs or other similar works;
3. when in the service of a Local Authority or a Water Authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; and
4. for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.

Full details of the proposal are in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the affected length of road and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected during usual office hours, Monday to Friday, at the Town Hall, Torquay or at the address below.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order you must send the grounds for your objection, in writing, to the undersigned by 6th January 1976.

The County of Devon (Various Streets, Totnes) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1976

Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) and section 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended.

When the proposed Order comes into effect, you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle at any time in the following lengths of road:

Coronation Road (A.384), both sides, from its junction with Fore Street and The Plains to its junction with Station Road.

Station Road, both sides, from its junction with Priory Drive for a distance of 110 yards in a north-westerly direction.

Unnamed Road leading to the Industrial Estate:

- north side, whole length;
- south side, from its junction with Station Road for a distance of 17 yards in an easterly direction;
- south side, from a point 60 yards east of its junction with Station Road for a distance of 107 yards.

Unnamed Road leading to Swimming Pool:

- west side for a distance of 7 yards in a northerly direction;
- east side for a distance of 15 yards in a northerly direction.

There will be exceptions in the proposed Order to permit waiting for the purpose of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading or unloading goods;
- (c) collecting or delivering postal packets for the Post Office;
- (d) taking in petrol, oil, water or air from a garage;

and where necessary in connection with:

- (e) the maintenance of the road, and
- (f) the supply of gas, electricity and water, and
- (g) the services of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

Subject to the compliance with the requirements of the appropriate regulations, provision is made in the Order allowing disabled persons' vehicles to wait for a maximum period of two hours (no return within one hour) in the lengths of road mentioned above.

Full details of the proposals are contained in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the affected

lengths of roads and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be inspected during usual office hours, Monday to Friday, at the offices of South Hams District Council, Follaton House, Plymouth Road, Totnes, or at the address given below.

The County of Devon (Various Streets, South Brent) (Prohibition and Limitation of Waiting) Order, 1976

Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) and section 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended.

When the proposed Order comes into effect, you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle:

- (1) at any time in specified lengths of Totnes Road, Plymouth Road, Fore Street, Church Street and Station Road;
- (2) between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. daily in specified lengths of Chapel Fields and Totnes Road;
- (3) for a longer period than one hour, no return within one hour, between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday, in specified lengths of Fore Street, Church Street and Station Road.

There will be exceptions in the proposed Order to permit waiting for the purpose of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading or unloading goods;
- (c) collecting or delivering postal packets for the Post Office;
- (d) taking in petrol, oil, water or air from a garage and where necessary in connection with:
- (e) the maintenance of the road;
- (f) the supply of gas, electricity and water, and
- (g) the services of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

Subject to compliance with the requirements of the appropriate regulations, provision is made in the Order allowing disabled persons' vehicles (i) to wait for a maximum period of two hours (no return within one hour) in the lengths of road mentioned in (1) and (2) above; and (ii) to wait in the lengths of road mentioned in (3) above.

Full details of the proposals are contained in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the affected lengths of roads and a statement of the County Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be inspected during usual office hours, Monday to Friday, at the offices of South Hams District Council, Follaton House, Plymouth Road, Totnes or at the address given below.

The Devon County Council (Littlehempston Bridge, Littlehempston) (Weight Restriction) Order 1976

Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended.

When this Order comes into force you will not be allowed to drive any vehicle any axle weight of which whether laden or unladen is or exceeds 7 tons in that length of the Class III road No. 88 carried over the River Hems by a bridge at Grid reference SX 813 628 and known as Littlehempston Bridge at Littlehempston in the District of South Hams in the County of Devon.
