- (a) prohibit the use by all vehicles, except public utilities service vehicles used for the purpose of providing, maintaining or repairing electricity, gas, sewer, water and Post Office telephone, telegraph and tele-communications services in, near or under the High Street, emergency services vehicles used for the purposes of attentions. attending emergencies at, in or near the High Street, vehicles of Contractors undertaking work at premises in the High Street which do not have adequate rear service accesses and local authority vehicles used rear service accesses and local authority vehicles used for the purpose of providing, maintaining or repairing public services in, near or under the High Street from using that length of Slough High Street from its junction with Windsor Road to its junction with The Grove between the hours of 10.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Saturdays;
- (b) prohibit the waiting, loading or unloading of any vehicles, except invalid carriages, vehicles issued to disabled persons in lieu of an invalid carriage, vehicles showing a disabled person's orange badge or vehicles showing a disabled driver's permit issued by the Borough Council, in those lengths of Church Street, Park Street and Alpha Street to a point approximately 15 metres south from the back of the High Street footpath line and that length of The Grove to a societ approximately 18 metres could from the High Street. point approximately 18 metres south from the High Street kerb line between the hours of 10.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Saturdays.
