3. The M.62 Lancashire-Yorkshire Motorway (Tarbock to Croft Section) Connecting Road Scheme 1969/1892). 1969 (S.I.

The special road provided in pursuance of this Scheme described in Part 1 of the Schedule thereto and referred to by the number 1. This is a route to connect the eastbound carriageway to the M.62 with the roundabout on Cronton Road (A.5080) at Tarbock.

## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1967

The Exeter-Leeds Trunk Road (Prohibition of Waiting) (Clearways) Order, 1975

The Secretary of State for the Environment has made an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and by Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 on the Exeter-Leeds Trunk Road (A.38) in the County

of Staffordshire.

The effect of the Order which comes into operation on 15th December 1975, will be to prohibit waiting on any verge adjacent to the north-western main carriageway of that length of the trunk road which extends from a point 600 yards south-west of its junction with Main Street, Alrewas (A.513) to a point 200 yards north-east of that junction. Waiting is prohibited on the main carriageway by the existing Order.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicles to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle or sold from a vehicle provided they are delivered immediately, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein or if it is an emergency vehicle. Disabled drivers will be exempt from the waiting restriction on the verges for period of up to 2 hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of or of any provision contained in the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or any instrument made under any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of the 12th December 1975 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
