Notice is hereby given that the Greater London Council propose to make the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by the Transport Act 1968 and the Road Traffic Act 1974.

2. The general effect of the Order would be further to amend the Hounslow (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1971, so that:

(a) in the length of Lampton Road specified in Schedule 1 to this notice:

(i) the hours during which the existing prohibition applies on the waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be changed so that it would apply at any time of the day or night throughout the week

(ii) subject to any existing prohibition on the waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle the hours during which the existing prohibition applies on waiting for such purpose for a period of more than 20 minutes in the same place would be changed so that it would apply between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. throughout the week

(b) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading
