Notice is hereby given that on the 12th December 1975, the Hampshire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The Order becomes operative as from 2nd January 1976, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 2nd January 1976, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

PART I

Description of Site of Existing Path

That part of the footpath in the Parish of Mattingley in the District of Hart shown on the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way under Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949, as Footpath No. 10 between a point on the drive of West End Cottage, 5 yards east of its junction with Road U.236, and a point 135 yards east thereof.

PART II

Description of Site of Alternative Highway

A footpath commencing at a point on the existing path 5 yards east of the gate at its junction with Road U.236, yards east of the gate at its junction with Road U.236, southwards across a ditch bridged by a plank, then over a stile into a field, then eastwards for 133 yards along a 6 feet wide grass path on the south side of a hedge and fence to rejoin the existing path at the eastern end of the length described in Part I of this Schedule; a total distance of 138 yards. Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on the 12th December 1975, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirm-ation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the

Hampshire County Council. The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifi-cation, will be to divert the public rights of way described in Part I of the Schedule hereto to the routes described in Part II of the Schedule.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any objections and representations which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

PART I

Description of Site of Existing Path

Those parts of the footpaths in the Parish of Sherborne St. John shown on the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way prepared under Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949 as Footpaths Nos. 13 and 16 as described below:

(a) Footpath No. 13 (E—D on the plan) That part of Footpath No. 13 which commences at the junction with Footpath No. 14 and runs in a generally north-easterly and northerly direction for 820 yards.

(b) Footpath No. 13 (C—B on the plan) That part of Footpath No. 13 which commences at a point 85 yards north of the northern end of the path described in (a) above, and runs in a north-westerly direction for 153 yards to its junction with Footpath No. 16.

(c) Footpath No. 16 (A-B on the plan) That part of Footpath No. 16 which commences at a point 93 yards north of Footpath No. 15 and runs in a north-easterly direction for 437 yards to join Footpath No. 13.

(a) Footpath No. 13 (F-D on the plan)
A six feet wide grass headland path commencing at the junction with Footpath No. 14 at a point approximately 170 yards east of the present path and running in a northerly direction along the west side of a stream for 586 yards then in a westerly direction for 26 yards then in a north north-westerly direction on the west side of Morgaston Wood for 206 yards then in a westerly direction for 134 yards to join the existing footpath at point D; a total distance of 952 wards. 952 yards.

(b) Footpath No. 13 (C-B on the plan) A six feet wide grass headland path commencing at the southern end of the path described in Part I (b) of this Schedule and running in a northerly direction on the west side of Morgaston Wood for 111 yards then in a west north-westerly direction for 75 yards to join the existing footpath; a total distance of 186 yards.

(c) Footpath No. 16 (A-B on the plan) A six feet wide grass headland path commencing at the southern end of the path described in Part I (c) of this Schedule and running in a westerly direction for 10 yards then in a north north-westerly direction for 10 yards then in a north north-westerly direction for 41 yards then in a westerly direction 40 yards then in a northerly direction for 243 yards to the corner of Pollards End Copse then easterly for 10 yards then north-westerly for 171 yards then in a generally easterly direction for 118 yards to join Footpath No. 13; a total distance of 633 yards.
