Hanover, April 29. N. S. An Express dispatched by the Resident of this Court at Vienna, lately brought his Electoral Highness the Investiture of Great Treasurer of the Empire. Last Week the Dake of Wossembuttel returned from Bamberg to his own Dominions, accompanied by his Highness's Daughter, the Abbess of Ganderskeim.
