The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of the public right of way, in the Parish of Longparish in the District of Test Valley in Hampshire and shown on the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way prepared under Part IV of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949, as footpath number 29, commencing at a point 85 metres North of the road B.3400 and running in a north-westerly direction for 40 metres, then north for 364 metres, a total distance of 404 metres to a line running from a point 85 metres north of the road B.3400 and running along the inside of the field boundary in a north-easterly direction for 140 metres and north for 300 metres and then north-westerly for 70 metres to rejoin the existing path. A total distance of 510 metres. The diverted path is to be a 1.2 metre wide grass path.

Ynys Mon-Isle of Anglesey Borough Council (Footpath No. 23 Holyhead Rural) Public Path Diversion Order, 1976.
