WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council of West Sussex (Southwick: Southwick Square) (Experimental Prohibition of Driving) (Extension No. 1) Order 1976.

Notice is hereby given that the West Sussex County Council, by Order under the provisions of section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and by Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, affecting Southwick Square, Southwick, have directed that "The County Council of West Sussex (Southwick: Southwick Square) (Experimental Prohibition of Driving) Order 1975" shall continue in force for a further period of 6 months until the 24th September 1976.

There is no change in the effect of the Order, which prohibits the driving of any vehicle in Southwick Square, Southwick.

Exceptions are provided in the Order to enable vehicles to proceed in Southwick Square if requiring access to premises in the Square, to pick up and set down passengers, goods or merchandise, or in connection with any building or demolition works, the repair of the road or the services therein. The Order does not apply to buses.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the length of road affected, may be inspected at the County Hall, Chichester, during normal office hours.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended as aforesaid, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from the 17th March 1976, apply to the High Court for this purpose.—

WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council of West Sussex (Burgess Hill: London Road (A.273) and Adjoining Roads) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) and (Burgess Hill: Park Close) (Prohibition of Waiting) Orders 1976.

Notice is hereby given that on the 17th March 1976, the West Sussex County Council made Orders under the provisions of section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, by Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and by Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effects of which are:

(a) to prohibit waiting at all times in certain lengths of the following roads in Burgess Hill:

London Road (A.273).
Park Road.
Park Close.
St. John's Avenue.
Newport Road.

(b) to limit waiting to 30 minutes, return prohibited within 1 hour, between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, in certain lengths on the west side of London Road (A.273), Burgess Hill.

Exceptions are provided in the Orders to enable vehicles to stop and pick up and set down passengers, goods or merchandise, to wait when engaged in building operations or the repair of the roads or the services therein, or to take in petrol, oil, air or water from a garage, and in connection with funerals. Invalid carriages, and disabled person's vehicles displaying badges and parking discs issued by any local authority under the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975, will be able to wait in the lengths of road referred to in paragraph (a) above for up to 2 hours, return prohibited within 1 hour, and the restrictions referred to in paragraph (b) above will not apply to such vehicles.

Copies of the Orders, which will come into operation on the 24th March 1976, and maps showing the lengths of road to which the Orders relate, may be inspected at the County Hall, Chichester, during normal office hours.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Orders, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended as aforesaid, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, may, within 6 weeks from the 17th March 1976, apply to the High Court for this purpose.—

WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council of West Sussex (Poynings: Dyke Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1976

Notice is hereby given that on the 17th March 1976, the West Sussex County Council made an Order under the provisions of section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and by Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is to prohibit waiting at all times on both sides of Dyke Road, in the parish of Poynings, from its junction with Saddlescombe Road, northwards to the Dyke Road Hotel car park, a distance of 730 yards.

Exceptions are provided in the Order to enable vehicles to stop and pick up and set down passengers, goods or merchandise, to wait when engaged in building operations or the repair of the roads or the services therein, or to take in petrol, oil, air or water from a garage, and in connection with funerals. Invalid carriages, and disabled person's vehicles displaying in the relevant position disabled person's badges and parking discs issued by any local authority under the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1975, will be able to wait in the lengths of road concerned for up to 2 hours, return prohibited within 1 hour.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the lengths of road to which the Order relates, may be inspected at the County Hall, Chichester, during normal office hours. The Order will come into operation on the 24th March 1976.
