in St. Mary the Virgin's Churchyard, in the said Parish, which is shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto. Now therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Committee of the Privy Council on the 13th day of May next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 13th day of May.
