NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

*Doncaster Borough Council Public Path No. 9
(Rossington) Diversion Order 1976*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 19th March 1976, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Doncaster Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish the public right of way running from a point marked A on the map attached to the Order for a distance of approximately 128 metres to a point marked B on the said map and create an alternative highway in lieu to a line running from the said point B in North Westerly direction for a total distance of approximately 241 metres via points C and D to point E.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the office of the Director of Legal and Administrative Services, Danum House, St. Sepulchre Gate, Doncaster, and may be inspected free of charge at that office between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 4.45 p.m. on Mondays and Fridays.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Director of Legal and Administrative Services, Danum House, St. Sepulchre Gate, Doncaster (quoting reference number 20/05/63) not later than the 24th April 1976, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Doncaster Borough Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert that part of Loders Footpath 38 running from a point at map reference 49759430 approximately 180 yards south-west of its junction with Smishops Lane south-westwards to join New Street Lane at map reference 49619414 to a line running from the said point at map reference 49759430 approximately southwards following the eastern boundary of the development site to its south-eastern corner thence westwards for a distance of approximately 30 yards to join New Street Lane at map reference 49659413.
