ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT 1931

Regulations made by the Architects Registration Council of the United Kingdom under section 13 of the above-mentioned Act have been submitted for the approval of the Privy Council and are published herewith.

Representations by persons to whom the Regulations are applicable may be made in writing to the Privy Council Office on or before the 28th day of April 1976.

ARCHITECTS REGISTRATION COUNCIL OF THE UNITED KINGDOM

Regulations made in pursuance of section 13 of the Architects (Registration) Act 1931, amending the Disciplinary Regulations of the Council.

After Regulation 4 of the Disciplinary Regulations add the following Regulation:

1. "4A (1) The notice of the proposed inquiry may require the applicant and the registered person to attend before the Clerk on a date not earlier than 14 days before the date fixed for the holding of the inquiry; and on their attendance before him (whether in person or by counsel or solicitor) or (where the Clerk is satisfied that the notice has been served) in default of attendance, the Clerk shall give such directions of an inter-

locutory nature as appear to him appropriate for the just, expeditious and economical disposal of the application: provided that if the Clerk is satisfied that directions are unnecessary he may, with the consent of the parties, dispense with the requirement to give such directions and the requirement to attend upon him for that purpose.

- (2) The Clerk shall, if so required by the applicant or the registered person, refer to the Chairman for his decision any direction given under this Regulation.

2. Delete Regulation 9 of the Disciplinary Regulations and substitute the following Regulation:

"9. The Discipline Committee may receive oral, documentary or other evidence which appears to them relevant for the purposes of the inquiry, whether or not such evidence would be admissible in a court of law: provided that the Committee shall only receive evidence which would not be admissible in a court of law, if the Chairman is satisfied that it is desirable in the interests of justice to receive it having regard to the difficulty and expense of obtaining evidence which would be so admissible."

Where as the Secretary of State for the Environment, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of St. Peter's, Cleasby, in the County of North Yorkshire, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853 as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in St. Peter's Churchyard, in the said Parish, as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 1st day of May next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 1st day of May.
