NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971, SECTION 210

*The Warwick District Council Diversion of Footpath
W.105 (Bishops Tachbrook) Order, 1976*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 18th March 1976 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Warwick District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way running from a point approximately 265 metres north-west of its junction with Church Hill, Bishops Tachbrook, for a distance of 113 metres to a point 378 metres north-west of its junction with Church Hill, to a line running from the said point 265 metres north-west of its junction with Church Hill, north-eastwards for 8 metres, north-westwards for 36 metres, south-westwards for 13 metres, westwards for 40 metres, north-westwards for 22 metres, westwards for 15 metres, north for 15 metres, rejoining the existing path at a distance of 378 metres north-west of its junction with Church Hill.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the office of the undersigned from Monday to Friday inclusive during normal office hours.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the undersigned not later than 17th May 1976 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Warwick District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

NATIONAL COAL BOARD

OPENCAST COAL ACT 1958

Notice is hereby given that the National Coal Board intend to submit an application entitled the Newgate II Application 1976 to the Secretary of State for an authorisation under section 1 of the Opencast Coal Act 1958, to work coal by opencast operations or to cause or permit coal to be worked by such operations and for and Order under section 15 of that Act suspending a public right of way. The land which the National Coal Board require to occupy in this connection and the right of way to which the application for the Order relates and the alternative way which the National Coal Board propose to make available are described below. A copy of the application and of the accompanying map may be seen between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays and 10 a.m. and 12 noon on Wednesdays and Saturdays excepting on Bank or Public Holidays at the offices of the National Coal Board, Housewarming Centre, 15 Cavendish Street, Chesterfield, Derbyshire.

Any objection to the application must be made in writing to the Secretary of State at the Department of Energy, Thames House South, Millbank, London, SW1P 4QJ before 26th April 1976, and should state whether it is to the grant of the authorisation or to the making of the Order suspending a public right of way and the grounds of objection.

Description of Land

The relevant land, which is about 54 acres in extent, is mainly in the Parish of Barlow in the District of North East Derbyshire in the County of Derby. The remaining part is in the Borough of Chesterfield in the County of Derby. It is situated about 4.8 kilometres north-west of Chesterfield, about 250 metres east of Barlow and about 800 metres north-north-east of Cutthorpe. It lies to the east of the County Road known as Hackney Lane (B.6051) and is bounded on the south-east by Sud Brook.

The relevant land is included in O.S. Sheet Nos. SK.3474 and SK.3574 (both 1963 Edition). Scale 1/2500.

Description of Public Right of Way

Parish of Barlow

Part of a footpath which runs from its junction with Hackney Lane in a general east-north-easterly direction for a distance of about 890 metres being that part which runs from a point about 170 metres east-south-east of Oaklands in a general east-north-easterly direction for a distance of about 530 metres and then in a general east-south-easterly direction for a distance of about 135 metres to its termination on the Sud Brook at the Parish Boundary at a point about 590 metres north-east of Sudbrook Farm.

Description of Alternative Way Proposed to be Made Available

An alternative way which would run from its junction with the footpath described above at a point about 170 metres east-south-east of Oaklands in a general northerly direction for a distance of about 250 metres, then in a general east-north-easterly direction for a distance of about 235 metres, then in a general south-south-easterly direction for a distance of about 130 metres and finally in a general east-south-easterly direction for a distance of about 420 metres to rejoin a footpath at a point about 590 metres north-east of Sudbrook Farm.
