Etters from Spain, of the 22d of the last Month, confirm the Account we received of the Impri-forment of the Duke of Medina Celi, who was ariented on the 15th, in the Office of the Secretary of State, by Monlieur Idiaquez. Major of the Guards, who conducted him to Torre de Lodones, five Leagues from Macrid, from whence he was conveyed to the Cattle of Segovia by Mr. Patrick Norris. We have an Account from Arras, that the Marefchal de Villars is not expected there before the 12th Infant. A Drummer is just now come out of the Town, to enquire after several Officers and Soldiers who are milling fince last Night's Act on. Lieutenant-Celon-I Gledhill, of Colonel Sutten's Regimen, was dangeroufly wounded, and is now a Prifoner in the Town.

From the Camp before Dousy, May 12. N. S. The greatest part of our heavy Arrillery for the Siege arrived in the Camp on the 9th; and that no time might be lost while we are cleaning the Passage of the Scarpe, several hundreds of the Waggons of the Army have been em-ployed for three days past in bringing the Ammunicion forward from Tournay, whence the rest of our Artillery is expected in a day or two; in the mean time we have advanced our Approaches to the first Ditch, and finished a Battery of twenty four Pieces of Cannon, and eight Morrars at each Attack, which will be ready to fire to Morrow Merning, in order to dishount the Enemy's Guns, and suin their Defences. On Saturday all the Quarter-Ma-sters were ordered to go and mark the Ground appointed for ranging our Army in order of Battel, from the Right at Montigny, near Henin Lietard, to the Lett at Vitty, and three thousand Workmen are likewise ordered thisher to be employed in fuch Places as may be necessary tor making Batteries, or otherwife improving the Ground to the best Advantage. The Enemy's Troops continue to affemble in different Bodies, but do not ver begin to draw together: It is faid the Marcichal de Villars is expected on these Frontiers to Morrow.
