

near Cambray having appeared two days together near Arloux, where we have taken Post with five hundred Men, a Reinforcement of two hundred Men is sent to join them; and a Body of Horse and Foot is ordered to be always in readines to march to their Relief, upon a Signal appointed to be made, if the Enemy should attempt any thing upon that Post. Yesterday Morning at Break of Day our Batteries began to fire at both A tacks, and have ever since plied the Enemy's Works so warmly that their Fire is almost ceased; and we are now making Overtures by the way of Sappe, into the first Fosse, in order to fill it up. His Grace the Duke of Marlborough is gone this Morning with the Prince of Savoy to view the Post of Arloux, as likewise to survey the Ground between that Place and the Scarpe, and give Directions for the marking a Field of Battel on the Plains towards Valenciennes, in case the Enemy shall attempt to succour Douay on that side; our Works on the other side between Montigny and Vitry being finished. Monsieur Dopff, with the Troops from the Maes, that were ordered to encamp near Townay, for the Security of our Artillery's coming from thence for the Siege, have this Day taken their Post in the Line; and the Hessian Troops have Orders to hasten their March, so as to join us the beginning of next Week.

Hague, May 16. N. S. The French Plenipotentiaries have for several days given out, that they were on their Departure for the Court of France; their Baggage was made ready, in order to be embarked; and they gave out that it would be sent on Board a Yacht, which they had hired for that Service, on Monday or Tuesday last; but Yesterday in the Evening they received Dispatches by a Courier of the French King's Cabinet, which they have signified to the Council of State by an Exprest this Morning, and it is probable that their Journey will be deferred. The Hessian Troops encamped Yesterday in the Neighbourhood of Brussels; and part of the Palatines will arrive on the 18th Instant at Maestricht; all which Forces will join the Grand Army before the Enemy can assemble their Troops, which cannot be done before the end of this Month. They write from Lille, that forty or fifty Deserters come daily over to that City from the Enemy's Frontiers, who unanimously report that the French Troops undergo such Misery, that a great part of their Army were disposed to follow their Example. A Brigadier's Commission hath been given to Engineer General des Reques,
