Two English Men of War met the Privateers after they had left the Packet boat, and have brought one of them into this Port.

Falmouth, May 20. This day sailed the Mercury Packet boat, with two Mills for Lisbon, Captain Green Commander, and about seventy Recruits for the Service in Portugal. There is now no Packet-boat in Harour.

Durham, May 21. Yesterday came in here the Brotherhood of Plymouth, from Weymouth, and was conveyed higher to Portland by her Majesty's Ships the Southsea Castle and Cruiser, which are returned to the Eastward. This day came in the Windsor of and from London with Coals.

Bristol, May 21. This day sailed out of Kingroad her Majesty's Ship the Shoreham, and under her Convoy the Antelope for Cork and Jamaica; and the Bewdley Galley for Antigua, and several small Vessels for Ireland.

Farmouth, May 22. This day passed through our Road a Fleet of laden Colliers from Newcastle to the Southward with their Convoys.
