The Trunk Road (Pont Llanelltyd, Gwynedd) (Prohibition of Traffic) Order 1976

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic the Transport Act 1968 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974 which shall come into operation on 1st August 1976. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit vehicles other than pedal cycles, from using that length of the superseded trunk road (A470), at Llanelltyd in the county of Gwynedd, which is carried by Pont Llanelltyd. A copy of the Order, together with a plan and statement of reasons for making the Order may be seen during normal office hours at the offices of the Meirionnydd Dis-trict Council, Penarlag, Dolgellau, during a period of 6 weeks from 23rd July 1976. If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regu-lation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within the aforesaid period of 6 weeks apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein. therein.

The Llandeilo--Carmarthen Trunk Road (Whitemill, near Carmarthen By-Pass Side Roads) Order 1976

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that in relation to the above-mentioned trunk road at Whitemill, near Carmarthen in the county of Dyfed he has made the following Orders:

- 1. An Order under section 7 of the Highways Act 1959 which provides:
- (a) that a road which he proposes to construct at White-mill near Carmarthen in the county of Dyfed shall become a trunk road as from the date when the Order
- (b) that the length of the Llandeilo—Carmarthen Trunk Road (A40) to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by him to the County Council of Dyfed (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the new trunk road is open for through traffic.
- 2. An Order under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 authorising him:
- (a) to stop up highways,
- b) to construct new highways,
- (b) to construct new nighways,
 (c) to stop up private means of access to premises, and
 (d) to provide new means of access to premises,
 all at Whitemill, near Carmarthen aforesaid, and to provide for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Dyfed as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been experienced and and an experience. have been completed and are open for through traffic.

Copies of the Orders and of the relevant plans have been deposited at the Welsh Office, Cathays Park, Cardiff, and at the offices of Dyfed County Council, County Hall, Car-marthen, where they are open to inspection free of charge at all reasonable hours.
