*Water Shortage**Notice of application for Emergency Order relating to a reduction in Statutory Compensation Release from the Avon Reservoir into the River Avon.*

Notice is hereby given that whereas in view of an exceptional shortage of rain, a serious deficiency of supplies is threatened in the area of the South West Water Authority which is served from the Avon Reservoir in the parishes of Dean Prior and South Brent in the District of South Hams.

Notice is therefore given that in order to maintain an adequate supply of water the Authority is applying to the Secretary of State for the Environment for an Order pursuant to section 1 of the Drought Act, 1976 to enable it for the period of the present emergency and for a period, in any case, not exceeding six months, to reduce the flow of compensation water from the Avon Reservoir into the River Avon from 5.91 t.c.m. (1.3 million gallons) in any period of 24 hours as required by Licence of Right to Abstract water No. 14/46/05/0069/01 and 09/10 to 1.59 t.c.m. (0.35 million gallons) in any period of 24 hours.

*Water Shortage**Notice of application for Emergency Order relating to the reduction of flow of Compensation Water from Fernworthy Reservoir into the River South Teign.*

Notice is hereby given that whereas in view of an exceptional shortage of rain, a serious deficiency of supplies is threatened in the area of the South West Water Authority which is served from the Fernworthy Reservoir, in the parishes of Chagford and Lydford in the West Devon District.

Notice is therefore given that in order to maintain an adequate supply of water the Authority is applying to the Secretary of State for the Environment for an Order pursuant to section 1 of the Drought Act, 1976 to enable it for the period of the present emergency and for a period, in any case, not exceeding six months, to reduce the flow of compensation water from Fernworthy Reservoir into the River South Teign from 3.41 t.c.m. (0.75 million gallons) in any period of 24 hours as authorised by the South West Water Authority (Fernworthy Reservoir) (Drought) Order 1976 to 1.36 t.c.m. (0.3 million gallons) in any period of 24 hours.

*Water Shortage**Notice of Application for an Emergency Order relating to abstraction from the Rivers Exe, Culm and Creedy*

Notice is hereby given that whereas in view of an exceptional shortage of rain a serious deficiency of supplies of water is threatened in the area of the South West Water Authority which is served from the North Bridge Intake in the parish of Exeter in the district of Exeter.

Notice is therefore given that in order to maintain an adequate supply of water the Authority is applying to the Secretary of State for the Environment for an Order pursuant to section 1 (3) (e) and section 3 (4) of the Drought Act 1976, to enable it for a period not exceeding six months to vary the licence relating to the abstraction from the River Exe by means of the North Bridge Intake at NGR SX 931970 as contained in Licence to Abstract Water Numbers 4/45/02/1861/0100 and 14/45/02/1862/0100, so as to provide that the permitted abstraction of 29.00 t.c.m. (6.38 million gallons) in 24 hours may be abstracted from the Pynes Leat at NGR SX 913960 and to do associated work.

AUTHORITY*Welsh National Water Development Authority (Llwyn-On Reservoir) (Drought) (No. 2) Order 1976*

Notice is hereby given that in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 1 of the Drought Act 1976, the Secretary of State for Wales on the 11th August 1976 made the above mentioned Order.

The effect of the Order is to enable the Authority to modify the provisions of sections 3 and 4 of the Cardiff Corporation Act 1955 which relate to the discharge of compensation water from the Llwyn-On Reservoir into the River Taff Fawr and to the flow of water over the Ffrwd Gauge in the said river in the following manner:

To reduce the amount of compensation water the Authority is obliged to let flow from the reservoir from 4,000,000 gallons per day as required by the said Act of 1955 (reduced to 2,000,000 gallons per day by the Welsh National Water Development Authority (Llwyn-On Reservoir) (Drought) Order 1976) to 500,000 gallons per day and to reduce the flow of water over the Ffrwd Gauge from 5,750,000 gallons per day as required by the said Act of 1955 (reduced to 2,000,000 gallons per day by the said Order of 1976) to 500,000 gallons per day. The Order has the effect of revoking the said Order of 1976 and shall remain in force until the 11th February 1977 or until such time as the Llwyn-On Reservoir is three-quarters full whichever is the sooner.

A copy of this Order is deposited at the Authority's Headquarters' Office at Cambrian Way, Brecon, Powys, and at the office of the Taff Water Division of the Authority, Pentwyn Road, Nelson, Treharris, Mid-Glamorgan, and may be inspected at any time during normal office hours.
