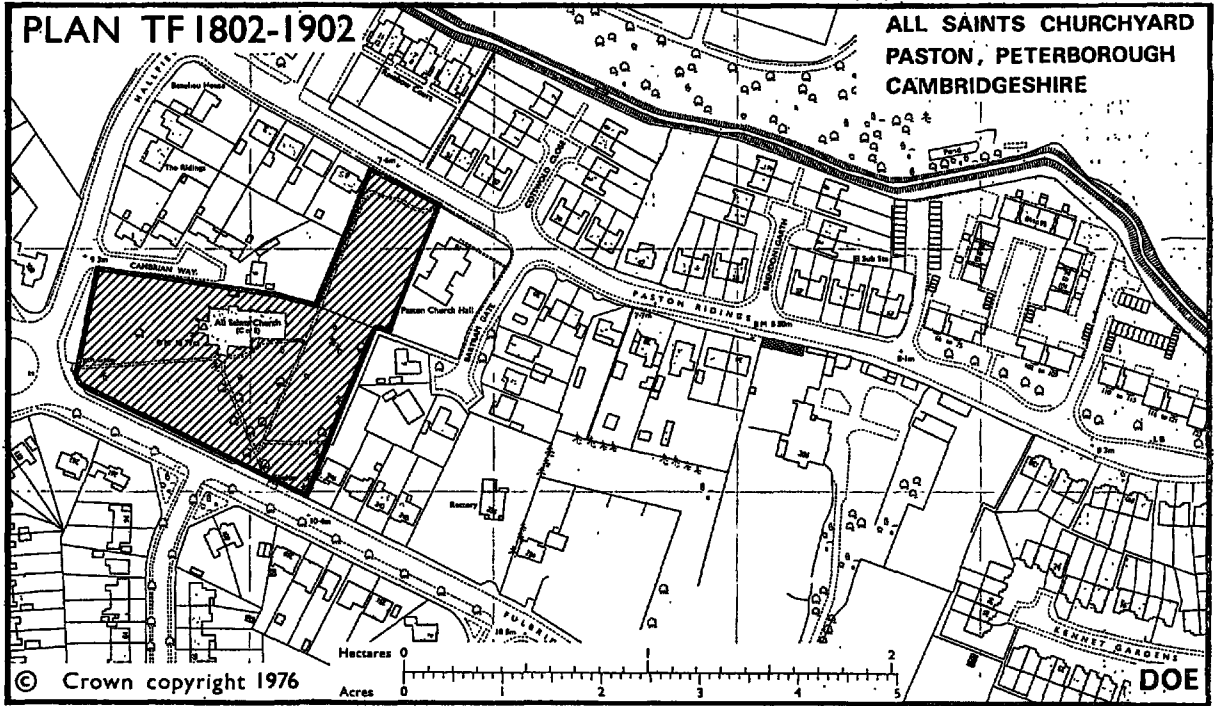


The Plan referred to in the foregoing Order in Council



At the Court at Buckingham Palace the 30th day of July 1976.

Present,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for the Environment that burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in part of St. Andrew's New Churchyard, Stainland, in the County of West Yorkshire, has in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 12th day of April 1976, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (1853

c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in that part of St. Andrew's New Churchyard, Stainland, in the County of West Yorkshire, which is shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that interment may be allowed in any vault or walled grave now existing in the said part of the said New Churchyard, subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed in stone-work or brickwork properly cemented.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (St. Andrew's New Churchyard, Stainland, West Yorkshire) Order 1976.
