Whoreupon the people gave a great shout, crying, God blefs Pope Clement the X. and immediately all the Great Guns ware fired from the Caftle of St Angelo, and the Edisbegan to ring in all parts of the City.

This done, the people flockt in great numbers to St Peters Church to fee the new Pope, whither the Cardinals came two and two from the Conclare, but without obferving any order of Precedency, after them the Crofs with leveral Quires of excellent Mulicky followed by the Clergy, and then the Pope carriedon high, that he might be -feen by the people, to whom as he paffed, he gave his benediction, they continuing their acclamations, till being placed upon the high Altar, he was there a third time adored by the Gardinals and Ambaffadors; which ended, the Pope ovas conducted to his Palacos and the Cardinals tretited themfelves to their respective houses.
