Provided that in the one earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons hereto-fore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the sround adjoining the grave. Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby


