Warfaw, June 1. N. S.

N the 28th of the last Month the King set out from Villa-Nova towards Marienburg in Prussia, and dined that day at Billani, two Leagues distant from this City: After Dinner the foreign Ministers, who attended the King thither, having taken their Leave, his Majesty proceeded by Water towards Thorn. 20th General Fleming left this Place, in order to fall down the River after his Majesty, who hath appointed very short Stages, that the Court may join him in his Pas-Yesterday the Imperial, Danish and Durch Minifters began their Journey to Marienburg, where they are to be accommodated with Lodgings, at the Charge of his Majesty, according to the usual Custom of this Court, when the King makes any Progress. Yesterday a Courier arrived here from Riga, with Dispatches for his Majefty, and without making any flay in this City, fet out immediately for Thorn. We are not acquainted with the Contents of his Dispatches; but some conjecture he brings Advice of the Surrender of Wybourg; but others suppose he is fent from Prince Menzikoff, to signific to his Maje-fly the Intention of that Prince, to give him an Inter-view at Marienburg. Letters from Vilna, of the 19th of the last Month, say, that the Czar was sailed from Petersburg, in order to be present at the Siege of Wybourg. The Breach of the Place being already practicable, Preparations were making for the general Assault. His Czarish Majesty's Life-Guards were arrived at Petersburg, and had Orders to embark with the greatest Expedition. These Advices add, that the Muscovite Army before Riga had hitherto only continued the Bombardment of that Place, and had not yet invested the Place in form. The Troops that were quartered in Lithuania had Orders to march to that Camp; and Prince Menzikoff had published an Edich, forbidding them on Pain of Death to exact any further Contributions. It is faid, that notwith-flunding this Prohibition, a Muscovite Commissary had demanded Contributions at Vilna, for which the great General of Lithuania ordered him to be immediately imprisoned, and it is supposed he will undergo the Punishment denounced against such Offenders. Letters from Leopold of the same Date say, that they had Intelligence from the Governor of Miedzyboza, on the Frontier of the Country of the Cossicks, that the King of Sweden had not then left Bender, but was joined by a confiderable Body of Tartars: But it is probable these Reports are only defigned to alarm the Muscovires, and to oblige them to draw their Forces towards the Confines of Turky.

Copenhagen, June 14. N. S. On the 12th Instant a Danish Frigat arrived here from the East-Sea, with Advice that the Swedish Equadron was retired into Carli-croon, and had detached fitteen Men of War, the largest being of forty Guns, towards Finland. This Frigat confirms the former Advice that the Swedish Equadion had brought from the Coasts of Pomerania about six y Sail of Ships laden with Provisions and other Necessaries. The Danish Squadron under the Command of Admiral Guldenleuw is now under Sail towards the East Sea. are told that the Swedes have twenty five Ships of the Line of Battel well manned, and are refolved to come out of their Port and engage the Danish Squadron as soon as tappears on their Coast. The Danish Squadron is not yet compleatly manned. Those arrived from Norway want three thousand of their expected Complement; the Squadren is to confift of about twenty Ships of the Line of Battel, besides some Frigats and other Vessels of War

that are already in the East-Sea.

Berlin, June 14. N. S. On the 19th Instant the Margrave Albert went from hence to dine with the King at Charlottenburg, which was the first time that he stirred Abroad fince his late Indisposition. The next Night their Prussian Majesties lodged at Rukleben, at which Place they dined the day following with the Prince and Princess-Royal, and in the Evening returned to Charlottenburg, where the Court still continues. The King seems very well satisfied with the Behaviour of the States-General, in relation to the Differences that are depending be-tween his Majesty and the Prince of Nassau-Frieze, and it is expected that the next Post will bring Advice that the Affair of Loo and Deeren is determined in favour of his Prussian Majesty. It is believed his Prussian Majesty will speedily make a Journey into Holland. Yesterday Monsieur Rantzaw, the Danish Envoy, received his Master's Ratification of a Contract lately concluded with a Jew of this City for four thousand Horses; but this Merchant making several Pretences that he might be excused from the Performance of this Agreemen, his Danish Majesty hath been pleased to declare that he would be fatisfied with half that number: Notwithstanding this, the Ceurt having formerly prohibited, on very fevere Penalties, the Exportation of Herfes out of his Majefly's Dominions, the Jew raifes new Difficulties, and endeavours to dilengage himfelf from the Agreement. Saveral Officers and Domesticks belonging to the Duke of Courland, passed through this City on the 11th Inftant, in their way to Couriand from Bareith. His Profian Majefty appears very well farisfied with the Reception of his Nephew. the Duke of Courland, when he returned into his Dominions, and the Civilities that were shewn him by Prince Menzikow and the Muscovites. Letters from Warfaw of the 6-b Instanc advise us of the King of Poland's Arrival at Marienburg; and add, that the Saxons, who were quartered in that part of Prussia which belongs to the Crown of Poland, were in a Readiness to march; that the Muscovires, who are to be commanded by General Janus, were affembling near Sendemir; and that the Army of the Crown was encamped near Borfiyce. Letters from Mitrau of the same Date say, that the Muscovices had designed to attack the Suburbs of Riga on that Day, under the Command of Brigadier Staff; and that Prince Menzikow, before his Departure, had caused several Redoubts to be built along the Duna, to prevent any Succours from coming into the Town by Water.

Falmenth, June 19. Yesterday filled the Queen and Union Packet Doats for Lisbon, with feveral Soldiers and Officers on Board; and also a Galley that hath lain here some time bound for Cadiz. This Day arrived the Rifing Sun, James Clarkland Commander from Alicant, but last from Lisbon, of and for London, who reports that the Mercury facket-boat was arrived in the River of Lisbon, before he failed from that Port; and also that Captain Peck had fent in thither a French Merchantman

Falmouth, June 22. Yesterday her Majesty's Ships the Yarmouth, Assurance, Monk and York appeared off of our Harbour. The Affurance, commanded by Captain Paffinger,

Fastinger, harh taken and sent in here a French Privateer of eight Guns, and fifty three Men, which has been but one day at Sea, and was formerly the Swallow Packetboat, that was employed between this Port and Lisbon. The same day came in the Neptune, and two or three. The Vessels of this Port, under Convoy of the Southampton and Lizard, which are since falled to cruize. This day failed the Buffinburg Privateer, Captain Japine Comniander, to cruize.

Plimouth, June 23. On the 21st came in from Spithead the Portland and Valeur bound for Newfoundland, the Triton's Prize for Virginia, and under their Convoy the Weston Galley for Newfoundland, the Tyger for Virginia, and two Hoys with Malt for this Place. Yesterday Indee Her Majelty's Ship the Dover to the Eastward, as did his day the Ponce George of Copenhagen from the

East-Indies towards Denmark.

Dartmouth, June 23. On the 21st instant came in-to Torbas he Maj sty's Ships the Southampton and Lizard from croiling, and this day failed again. Her Majesty's Ships the Laucaster, and another third Rate, are now cruifing off this Harbour. On the 21st failed to the Westward, her Majesty's Ships the Portland, Valent, and Truon's Prize, with feveral Ships under their Convoy.

Tarmouth, June 23. The St. Albans failed yesterday with a Fleet of light Colliers and Coasters to the Northward; bur the Wind coming contrary, they are this Day returned. A laden Fleet, with their Convoys, is failed

to the Southward.

Hull, June 24. On the 22d Instant the Regiment of General Farrington, and yesterday that of Colo-On the 22d Instant the Reginel Moore, were embasked on board the Transports that have lain some time in this River. We daily expect the arrival of two Regiments more, which are immediately to be Shipp'd off, in order to sail with the first fair Wind for the Downs, under Convoy of her Majesty's Ships the Sheerness and Glasgow.

Brifol, June 24. On the 22d Instant came in the Martha Brigantine of London, William Courtney Master, in eight Weeks from Jamaiea. Her Majesty's Ships the Hastings and Shorcham's-Prize, with several outward-bound Merchantmen, are still in Kingroad Wind-bound.

Whitehall, June 26.
