Turin, June 11. N. S.

THE greater part of the General Officers of the Imperial Regiments are arrived here, and all the Troops, both Horse and Foot, are on their March this Yesterday General Martini's Regiment of Horse paffed through this Place on their way to Orbaffan, where all the Imperial Cavalry are to be encamped, before they advance towards the Mountains; their whole Infantry will also be specily at their respective Rendezvous at Montcallier, Montenard and St. Balein. We have Advice, that the Prussian Troops resulted to March out of their Winter Quarters in the Mantuan, upon some Differences haween them and the Imperial Commissaries, of which, 25 foon 25 the British and Dutch Ministers here were informed, they wrote both to the General who Commands those Troops, and to Marshal Dawn, to endeavour to end the Dispute; so that the opening the Campaign may not be retarded for want of that Body of Troops. All his Royal Highness's Horse are to be encamped within few Daysat Pancallie, his Foot being long fince upon the Frontiers towards Suza, Coni and the Valley of Aost. Royal Highness hath dispatched General Schulenburg, who is to Command the Troops in the Valley of Aost, from hence, upon Advice that the Enemics on that Frontier had made fome Motion; but that Movement is looked upon as made only to take Possission of some Posts which they March into at the entrance of every Campign. Marshal Dawn is expected here within few Days from Milan. We have had so great Rains of late in these Parts, that his Royal Highness, with the Court, are returned hither from the Venerie sooner than they were expected.

Turin, Tune 18. N. S. Last Sunday Marshal Dawn arrived here from Milan, All the German Troops which are to compole our Army, are arrived at their respective Quarters; but the March of the Prussian Troops is countermanded tpon some new Difficulties about the Payment of what is due to those Troops. The British and Dutch Envoys have interposed in this Affair, and have prevailed with the Marshal to leave the decision of the Dispute to them; and an Express is dispatched to inform the Commanding Officer of this Resolution; so that it is hoped thisse Troops will immediately March. Last Week a Courier from Paris passed through this Place for Rome, to obtain the Pope's Permission for the Duke of Berry to Marry the Duke of

Orleans's Daughter.

Genoa, June 15. N. S. The Regiment of General Brown, and that of General Ecks, arrived at Vado on the toth Inflatt, which were embarked immediately on Board the Transports hired for that purpose; as were also the German and Italian Recruits the Day following, besides three hundred and fifty Horse for remounting of the Earl of Rockies in Parking in Parki of Rochford's Dragoons. All these Troops being on Board. the Fleet fet Sail on Thursday the 12th Instant, with a brisk and tavourable Gale of Wind, the Body of the Fleet, with the Imperial Regiments and Italian Recruits, bearing towards Sardinia; and the Earl of Rochford's Regiment of Horse, with the Imperial Recruits, towards Bar-celons, under the Convoy of two Men of War. This Divilion was made upon the Advice the Admirals received of the Enemy's being gone to make a Descent in Sardinia, with eight Gallies under the Command of the Duke de Turfis, and a Body of two thousand Men under the Command of Lieutenant-General Joseph Armenduras, and two Brigadiers. The last Letters from Corsica bring us Advice, that those Gallies lay at an Anchor in Porto-I

Vecchio in that Island, from whence they had feat a Felucca, with some of the Natives of Sardinia, to get Intelligence, who were taken and carried into Cagliari; upon which the Viceroy immediately ordered a Body of eight hundred Horse to Patrole all along the Coast, and another of about one thousand Foot to repair to the Places most suspected, laying a firict Command upon them to Fire upon every armed Person, and to disperse all Assemblies that were met together in order to take up Arms. Two of the Pope's Gallies arrived here on the tith, Leing come to fetch a confiderable Sum of Mony which this Republick has lent them at Interest, whereof the Principal is to be repaid in 4 Years. Yesterday two of this Republick's Gallies returned hither from Corfica, with Monfieur Phillippo Catanco, late Governor of that Island, he being succeeded by the

Marquis de Reverole.

Vienna, June 18. N. S. On the 9th Inflant the Emperor reviewed at Schonborn the Regiment of Ruccavion, on its March from Hungary to the Upper Rhine; it confisted of one thousand Horse compleat, well mounted, and in very good order. On the 11th his Imperial Majesty removed with the Court to the New Favourite. Yesterday they went to Laxemburg for the Diversion of Hawking, where the great Faulkner prepared a curious Artificial Firework for their Entertainment; and this Day the whole Court returned to the Favourite. Monfieur Urbich, the Envoy of the Czar of Muscovy, returned lately from Poland to this City. He passed through Hungary in his way hither, and had a Conference with Prince Ragotski, to whom he complained of the Reception of his Czarish Majesty's Enemies into his Service: That Minifter had also Instructions to mediate a Peace between the Emperor and the Hungarians, and was ordered to make fome Proposals of Accommodation. Prince Ragouski and Prince Berezeni acquainted him with the Terms up-Prince Ragoiski on which they would enter into a Treaty, which conflited in the fame Points as their former Demands; that his Imperial Majesty should grant a general Pardon; that the Fundamental Laws of the Kingdom should be established, the quiet Possession of their Ritates secured, and such as have been already Confiicated be rettored to their Potierity. Monsieur Urhich, at his Departure, took with him a Quarier Master General, as a Deputy from the Malecontents for the further Explanation of these Articles; but at Presburg this Deputy was feized and imprisoned by the Command of Mareichal Palis, under pretext that he had no Passport. Monsieur Urbich highly resents the Bahaviour of General Palfi on this occasion, for arresting a Gentleman that had put himself under his Protection, and hath delivered a Memorial to the Emperor upon this Subject, in which he also insists on a Demand, that the Emperor should give the Czar the Title of Majesty. The Court hath given an Answer in Writing to that Memorial, containing in Substance. That the Emperor is very much surprized, that the Minister of the Czar of Muscovy should make any Overtures of Accommodation, or receive any Proposals from the Malecontents, without the Participation of this Court; and that this Officer, who came as Deputy from the Hungarians, not being a Domeflick of that Minister, they think he hath no manner of right to protect him. We do not hear that there is any An-fwer returned to that part of the Memorial relating to his Master's Demand of the Title of Majesty. Prince Eugene having desired that two Regiments of Horse and four Battalions of Foot be forthwith sent from the Upper Rhine to the Low Countries, this Court hath confented that the Regiments of Prince Emanuel of Savoy, and that of Roccavion shall march thisher, but have thought fir to refuse the four Battalions. The Bishop of five Churches, who was fent last Year into I-taly, with the Character of the Emperor's Commissivy-General, for accommodating the Differences between his Imperial Majeffy and the Duke of Savoy, hath leave to return hither for two Months, to regulate his private Affairs. Several hundreds of Recutits lately passed by this City in their way to Hungary; and great numbers of Horses are daily feat thither for remounting the Cavalry. General Firmand is returned from Rome, and is preparing to fet out for Hungary to command the Foot this Campaign. Cardinal Saxe Zeits went on Monday last to Presburg; and at the fame time Prince Lubomirski for out for Poland. Count Herbeistein is appointed E: voy Ex raordinary from this Courc to his Polish Majesty. Marshal Schlick is gone te Hungary, to give Orders for the more first Blockade of Newsausel. We have frequent Advices of the Succelles of small Parties of the Imperialift in those Parts.

Lisbon, June 20. N. S. On the 14th and 15th In-flant the Enemy marched into their Summer Quarters, and our Army retired to Sonte dos Sapateros, expecting the Orders of this Court to go into Quarters, which are already regulated. Hague, July 4. N. S. Yesterday a Conference was held, concerning the Affairs of the North, between the Deputies of this State and the Ministers of the other Princes that are particularly interested therein. The Prefervation of the Neutrality of the Empire was the principal Subject of this Conference, which they were appreherfive, by fome late Proceedings of the Swedes, they intended to Violate, notwithstanding the Declaration of the We bear that the Regency of Sweden to the contrary. King of Poland hath declared, that if the Swedish Troops in Pomerania shall attempt to make any Irruption into Saxony, Holftein or Poland, he will immediately enter Pomerania with an Army of ten thousand Men that are assembled near Marienburg. On the 26th of the last Month the Convoy from England, with the Pere-grine, the William and Mary and Henrietta Yachs, arrived fafely in the Meuse from Great Britain; and the Count de Tarucca, the Portuguese Ambassador, came here the next Morning with a numerous Retinue. His Excellency hath presented his Credentials to the States-General, who have received him as the Minister and Plenipotentiary of the King of Portugal, but he hath not yet taken upon him the Title or Ambassador. On the 30th he was introduced to the Congress of the Ministers of the Alies by Count Zinzendorf. The States General have made a Present of a Chain of Gold and a Meda', valued at eighteen hundred Florins, to Lieutenant-Colonal Kreitschmar, who brought hither the Capitulation of the Sieg: of Douzy from the Deputies of this State: Their High Mightinesses have also presented Major Rhebinder, Adjutant General of the Prince of Nassau, with a Chain of Gold, and a Medal worth fifteen hundred Florins, who brought a Letter of Congratulation from that Prince on the fime Occasion.
