
- Provided that— (a) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Church-yard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons here-tofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.
- (b) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the Privy Council on the 16th day of February next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 16th day of February.

5. Providing for the demolition of the redundant former parish church of St. Philip, Heigham, in the diocese of Norwich, and empowering the said Commissioners to sell its site and the land annexed or belonging thereto.
