## Mannamead Conservation Area

To the south the area is bounded by Wilderness Road, To the south the area is bounded by Wilderness Road, Mannamead Road, College Avenue, Meadfoot Terrace and Elm Road. The boundary turns north into Crow Park and follows the western boundaries of 1 Penrose Villas and Crow Park House. Turning east along Seymour Road and north along Seymour Park the boundary turns west on the southern boundary of 17 Seymour Park and passes up the eastern boundary of Hillside and follows the rear boundary line of the properties along Compton Avenue. 5, 7 and 9 Seymour Dr ve are excluded. On Dormy Avenue the boundary passes directly north-

On Dormy Avenue the boundary passes directly north-wards as far as Lower Compton Road following the shared boundary of 5 and 7 Compton Park Road. Turning west on Lower Compton Road the boundary turns north on the western boundary of 1 Lower Compton Road and west on the northern boundary of 100 Mannamead Road.

Following Mannamead Road northwards, Vapron Road westwards and Lovell Road southwards the boundary turns westward along the lane to the rear of Thornhill Road. South along Vapron Road and west on the southern boun-dary of 46 Vapron Road the boundary turns south along the castern boundary of 23 Glenwood Road, 1 and 2 Glenhurst Road, 19 and 21 Glenavon Road and the eastern boundary of Parklands. Running south-west along the southern boundary of Parklands and the northern boundary of Mutley Park House it follows the Park boundary along Oxford Gardens and Mutley Road. The boundary follows the rear boundaries of 42-51 Thorn Park and turns south and west back on Mutley Road. From the western boundary of Stormont the area includes a short length east on Hermitage Road and the boundary

a short length east on Hermitage Road and the boundary follows the western boundary of 1 Hermitage Road and finally rejoins Wilderness Road by way of the northern boundary of 26 Wilderness Road.

### The Hoe Conservation Area

All those properties lying west of Citadel Road, north of the shoreline as far as and including West Hoe Terrace. of the shoreline as far as and including West Floe Terrace. From the shoreline the boundary passes west of West Hoe Terrace following Great Western Road eastward as far as the eastern boundary of West Roe Terrace and then north to Eddystone Terrace. The boundary then goes north-cast to include the properties north-west of Grand Parade until it reaches the south-west boundary of West Use Death The head days are proved West Hoe Deated Forade until it reaches the south-west boundary of West Hoe Park. The boundary goes around West Hoe Park to the junction of Cliff Road and Leigham Street which it follows northwards as far as the rear of Leigham Terrace and then west behind Leigham Terrace and north at the western end of Leigham Terrace to join Citadel Road which it follows until it joins Millbay Road which it follows until The Crescent. The area includes the Con-inantil Head. The boundary follows the Concernt into tinental Hotel. The boundary follows the Crescent into Note Street and runs to the eastern boundary of Armada Way and includes 22-24 Lockyer Street. The boundary then runs south following the east boundary of Armada Way until Citadel Road, then turning east as far as the boundary of the Barbican Conservation Area then following Citadel Road back to the shore. Sussex Place and Saltram Place to the north of Citadel Road are included within the area.

#### Durnford Street Conservation Area

All those properties contained within the peninsula south of a line along Caroline Place and Barrack Place including 8-19 Stonehall Flats but excluding Millbay Docks up to the boundary of the Royal Marine Barrocks.

#### Plympton St. Maurice Conservation Area

Starting at George Cross the boundary goes east along Ridgeway to the eastern boundary of St. Peter's convent and following that boundary south to Longcause. The boun-dary goes west on Longcause to the east boundary of the graveyard and turns south to include the graveyard and the graveyard and turns south to include the graveyard and the old grammar school and then west and then south to include the cottages on Longbrook. Following Longbrook in a southerly direction the boundary circumscribes the garden boundary of St. El.zabeth's House of Rest where it picks up the footpath as far west as Barn Park Cottage. It then goes north along Six O'clock Lane joining Back Lane and proceeding to Dark Street Lane as far as the northern boundary of Ilbert Cottages from where it goes west and south to include Ilbert Woodbine Cottages and west and south to include Ilbert Woodbine Cottages and east along Barbican Road as far as Castle Close to include Castlehayes Cottage. The boundary returns to George Cross by way of George Lane, Castle Close, Grange House, Homeleigh-Castlehayes, Trevean and along the northern boundary of Culver Cotage.

#### The Barbican Conservation Area

All those properties bounded on the east side by the shorcline extending continuously from North Quay to Tinside, then northwards following the Citadel Walls and Tinside, then northwards following the Citadel Walls and excluding the Meteorological Observatory but including Hoe Gardens House, Hoe Gardens, Citadel Terrace and the building immediately north of Hoe Gardens House and at the rear of 20-21 Hoe Street, then following the street line of Hoegate Street, Notte Street Finewell Street, cross-ing westwards to Cather ne Street on the south boundary of the Prysten House and then encircling St. Andrew's Church to connect with Buckwell Street by way of ensured Street and following Bretonside porthwards and ensured Street and following Bretonside northwards and eastwards to turn south on Hawker Avenue to rejoin North Quay.
