Florence, July 1. N. S.

THE Expedition of the French and Spaniards, with the Gallies of the Duke of Turfit, against Sar dinia, is now at an end. Sir John Norris coming to an Anchor with the Fleer, at the Place where the Enemy had landed four bundred Men immediately feized upon the Barks that transported them; af er which the Imperial Troops landed, and marched up smelly to the Enemy, who, though they, had pol-filed themselves of a found Village called Terra-Nova, forendeed themselves Prisoners of Wor. Sir John Nursis took also in those Vessels eight hundred Barris of Powden twelve Pieces of Lannon, and there flor ars: After this the Admiral being informed, that the Dake of Turns with the Gallies and Come Backs, weere decained at Boniheld in Co-fice, image cliently made this bery but finding they were eleaped, he is to decimosher part of the Illand. where four Birks and fix hundred Men had revised, the Men for their fafery A a to the Mountains, and the Admiral having made harder Mafter of the Veffels and their Ammunition proceeded on his Voyage to Barcelom. The fix Galless belonging to the Pake of Turlis, with two of Sicily, are got to Genea, with eight lan ded Men on Beard, most of whom are Sick, and the Dake of Tuiss is likewif feized with a Fever. The Emmy have loft one thousand three hundred Men in this Expedition, besides all their Transports, Stores, Artillery and Amounting. The Pope, since his return from Ca-Md-Gandolfo, finds himfelf again indisposed, and his former Distempers are returned upon him; it is therefore beleved he will again remove in o the Country.

Wnice, July 4. N. S. The Chevalier Guissiani, the lateBally at Constantinople, is come out of the Lazzaretto. where he has been forty Days, and is gone to his Palace, where he is preparing to make a Selemn Entry into this City, in order to take upon him the Digni-y or Precurator of St. Mark. Mr. Broughton, the British Conful, haring for some time had a Patent as Conful from Spain, this Senate hath ordered those Vessels that come from form of which the King of Spain is in actual Possession, full pay the Duties to him. The Emperor's Ambassador in this State has presented a Memorial, protesting very warmly against the College, for accepting the Patent of the Duke of Anjou. which constitutes a Florentine his Consul bue. They write from Naples, that fix armed Felucca's of Liperi having taken fome Backs on the Coast of Naples. had been chased into a Greek, and were taken by the Nexpolitan Barks that were fent to purfue them; these Fema's were brought into Naples, having on Board one bundred and severity of the Pirares. Letters from Rome advife, that an Express to the Cardinal de la Tremouille had brought Letters from the French King to the Pope, defing a Dispeniation for the Marriage of the Duke of Bury with Madamoifelle d'Otleans. The Messenger that brought this Express was introduced to the Pope himfelt, and immediately disparched with the faid Dispensation. The Pope hath fent alto to Vienna the Bull for the Bi-hoprick of Facuza, which is given to his Nuncio Sig-mor Piazza, who had sife the Grant of a rich Abby in the Minneze. The Nuncio for this Republick was not Jet named. It was faid that the Frince of Faleftrino would picks: his great Palace, called Palazzo Barbarino, to the french King, that his idajesty may lodge his Ambassa-tor therein, and he is preparing for his Journey to Spain, where he is to be created Adjutent-General to the Duke

Vienna, July 5. N. S. Letters from Bender of the 5th pul fay, that the King of Sweden feemed resolved not to leave that Place, 'till he could return at the Head of an

Army; that he was in hopes the Sultan would not only permit the Tarrars to begin a War with Mulcovy (of which they are faid to be very defineus) but also that he himf. I would at last he prevailed upon to furnish his Sweeifit Majesty with a good Body of Troops. There are alto Advices from Constantinople, which say, that he King hath already assembled ten thousand Men at Bender. Yesterday Coun Schrahumbucht, Dean of the Chapter of Salizieurg, and Envoy-Extracreinary from the Archbishop. received from the Emperor the Investiture of the Temporalities of the Archbishoprick of Sal zburg. The Marquis Falbi, Envey Ex reordinary from the Republick of Genoa, is returned to Italy. General Heister and Marquis Cusani see out yesterday to Hungary. The Imperial Army is affembled in the Neighbourhood of Raab

From the Camp at Viller Brule, July 17. N. S. On Tuesday the 15 h the Troops appointed for the Siege of Bethune marched and invested that Place. General Schullenburg and General Fagel, who Command the Foot, are to have the direction of the two Attacke, with two Lientenants-General, four Majorr-General, and as many Brigadiers at each. A great part of the Artillery and Ammunition for the Siege lies ready at Douzy, and the refe will arrive on the 19th at Lifte from Ghent. In the mean-time, for the Security of their Pollings to the Singer and the fatery or our Convoys of Errad, the Heridiany Prime of Hefic marched this Morning with thiny Squadrons and twelve Battalions, with Orders to take Poft bitween Lens and la Baffes, and to break down all the Bridges on the Canal, except those at Pent à Vendin, where our Convoys are to pass.

Hague, July 18. N. S. The States of Holland and West-triczlind were re-essembled on the 16 is and the same Day the Lord Townsher I and the Pensionary Heinflus had a long Conference with the Durch Deputies that are employed in the Negotiations with the Ministers of The India Fleet being more numerous than usual; and very richly laden, the Arrival of it hard occulioned an extraordinary Joy. On the 14th a rich Fleet from the Baltick, confitting of fix y Veffels, came fate into the Texel, under Convoy of four Men of War. The Admirelty of Amsterdam hath commanded the Dutch Men of War that convoyed the Fleet from India, to attend the five English Ships that came in their Company, and to conduct them in fifery within the Mouth of the Thames. Yesterday in the Evening the Ambashdor of Muscovy received the News of the Surrender of Wyburg, on the 25th of June, to the Czar. Our last Advices from Flanthat General Wood is to command the Cavalry appointed to ferve in the Siege of Berhane, which is to confift of fix Imperial Squedrons, fix English and fix The Town was invested on the 15th with twenty fix Battalious, whereof three are English, nine Darch, and the rest are Germans and Augiliaries. The Number of the whole Detachment amounts to twenty thousand Men. The Garrison consists of nine Battelions, and some Squadrons of Dragoons; and we hear, that the Enemy have caused an Inundation on one fide of the Town. Mareschal Villars was encamped behind his new Lines; and the Generals of the Allies had ordered a Camp to be marked our, to cover the Siege. We have Advices by the way of France of the fafe Arrival of Sir John Norris, with the Confederate Fleet, and Imperial Reintorcements, at Barcelona.

Whitehall, July 13. The Queen has been pleased to appoint Brigadier-General Thomas Pulcency, Major General of Her Majesty's Forces, his Commission bearing cate with those of the General Officers, constituted at the late Promotion.
