HE Tartar Pink that brought over the Marquis Rofrano, a Grandee of Spain, in four Days from Barcelona, was fent back on the 5th Instant by Mr. Cherwand with the Packets he had received from England for Lieutenant-General Stanhope, and the Admirals Norris and Baker, having Colonel Harrisen, Colonel S: anhope, and fereral other English Officers on Board, who are going to heir respective Regiments in Spain. A great part of the Soldiers that returned on Board the Duke of Turfis's Galless are fince dead; two of those Vessels are appointed to transport the remainder to Porto-Longone, with Orders to fail from thence to Corsica, for those that saved themselves in that Island. We have advice by a Vessel lucly arrived from Spain, that Admiral Norris having difembarked the Prifoners he had on Board, at Barcelona, failed from thence to Terragona, where he landed the Imperial Reinforcements, that they may with more expedition Merch to the Confederate Camp at Portella, The Confederates, when joined by these Troops, will be enabled to purfue their Advantages in Arragon, where the Inhabitantsare very well disposed to his Catholick Majesty.

Last Wednesday Monsseur Ren zeu acquainted the King, that his Master the King of Denmark, had been plased, in confideration of the pressing Instances of the Allies, to revoke the Order he had given to hinder all Commerce with Sweden, by stopping any Ships that sould be bound to that Kingdom with such Merchandize a he had declared Contreband, and had ordered that all Vessels which have hicherto been stopt, under these Pretences, should be set at liberty. They write from Marienburg of the 1st Instant, that the Great General of the Crown was gone to Kaminici, to observe the King of Sweden, and to inform himself of the true Reason of his long stay at Bender. That General has given Order to the Troops to assemble near Nisko, on the River Hand. River Uzepi. They have lately been very much alarmed at Warfaw and Cracow with tresh Apprehensions of the Plague, which began to break out again in those Cities. fo that the Inhabitants for fook their Houses, and retired into the Country; but those Fears are now ceased, and the People were returned to their Habitations.

From the Camp at Viller-Brulin, July 24. N. S. The Disposition being made for breaking Ground before Bethune, the same was put in Execution last Night before the Gate of Arras, being the Ground appointed for General Fagel's Attack. Lieutenant-General Vinck had the Command, with a Major-General, a Brigadier, and two thousand Workmen, with four Battalions to cover thems they finish'd their Parallel with a good Communication before they were discover'd by the Enemy; so that on this side we did not sustain any manner of Lots. On the fide defign'd for General Schulemburg's Artick before the Gate of Ayre, two hundred and firy Workmen, covered by two hundred Fufiliers, took Postupon the Dyke. and began to cut it in three several ilices, in order to drain the Inundation; the Enemy made a great Fire from two Redoubts, but wounded only fix Men. Yesterday our Patroulles met with two of the Enemies Parties, one Yesterday of eighteen Mcn from Ayre, and the other of four and twenty from their Army, and brought them all Prisoners to the Camp. The Enemy feem at present to have no other design, than that of covering their own Country, and of intercepting our Convoys; for the former they have begun new Lines between Dourlens and Bappaume, and to prevent the latter, we have taken all the necessary Precautions, several Pieces of Cannon being for that purpose fent to the Prince of Heffe's flying Camp near Leas, and Dykes made in the Souchet, in order to fill that Piver in the Places where it was fordable.

Bruffels, July 26. N. S. The French Plenipotentiaries arrived here this Morning from Gertruydenberg, on their Way to the French Court. They dined with the Princess d'Isenghien, to whom the Mareschal d'Uxelles is related; after which they proceeded to Mons, where they are to Lodge this Night. Letters from Madrid of the 7th Instant Lodge this Night. Letters from Madrid of the 7th Instant fry, that by the last Advices from the Army they had an Account that Marshal Staremberg baving taken effectual Precautions for the Security of his Conveys, had fent feveral Detachments into Arragon; and there was a Report. that he had possessed himselt of Mongon. The Duke of A ijon's Army suffered very much for want of Provisions, their Communication with Arragon being cut off by the advantageous Situation of the Confederates; fo that the Duke had resolved to revire towards Lerida, and had fent

reflecting on the Conduct of the Deputies of the States in

the feveral Conferences, and by unfair Representations of Matters of Fact, and false Infinuations, endeavouring to throw the blame of the ill success of those Negotiations on the Allies. It is looked upon here as a plain discovery of the Infincerity of the French during this whole Affair; and being laid before the Deputies for Foreign Affairs, and by them communicated to the Ministers of all the Allies, it was unanimously concluded (fince the French had declared they thought any further Conferences useless, and had rejected the Proposals made to them) that it concerned the Allies no longer to give Credit to the Professions of the Enemy, but to continue the War with the utmost Vigour. These Sentiments of the Ministers of the Allies were immediately communicated to the States-General, who came to a Refolution, which was fent the same Evening to the Ministers of France, in Answer to their Letter, accompasied with a few Lines from the Pensionary, by a Domestick of the Abbot de Polignac; and we are fince advited that they are preparing to return to France. This. Letter of the French Ministers is por yet published; but it is faid, that they themselves caused Copies to be dispersed at Amsterdam and Rotterdam, with a defign to infinuate to the People that their Endeavours have been sincere towards obtaining a Peace. An Answer to the same, together with a more faithful and exact Relation of the Proceedings throughout the whole Negotiation, will be speedily made Publick here. To Morrow the States of Holland intend to Adjourn themselves to that Dzy Fortnight. A Company of Enthusiasts and pretended Prophets having deligned to fet up Meetings at Rotterdam, the Ma-gistrates of that City judged it convenient to Banish them out of their Territories, which was accordingly executed 12st Week.
