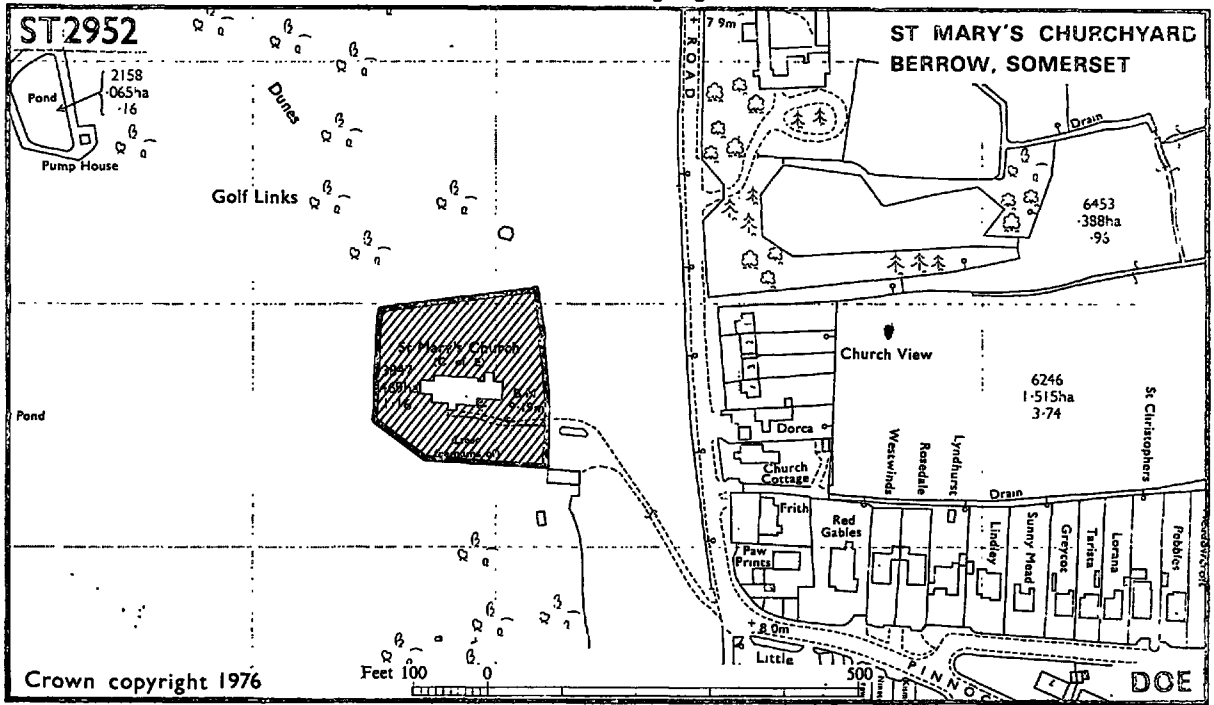


The Plan referred to in the foregoing Order in Council



At the Court of Saint James the 30th day of March 1977

PRESENT,

The Counsellors of State in Council

Whereas Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 3rd day of February 1977, to delegate to the six Counsellors of State therein named or any two or more of them full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council and to signify thereat Her Majesty's approval for anything for which Her Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Secretary of State for the Environment that burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in All Saints Churchyard, Slingsby, in the County of North Yorkshire, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto, has

in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 15th day of December 1976, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth The Queen Mother and Her Royal Highness The Princess Margaret, Countess of Snowdon, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, and in exercise of the powers conferred on Her Majesty by section 1 of the Burial Act 1853 (1853 c.134) and of all other powers in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, on Her Majesty's behalf order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in All Saints Churchyard, Slingsby, in the County of North Yorkshire, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (All Saints Churchyard, Slingsby, North Yorkshire) Order 1977.
