HIGHWAYS ACT 1959 AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1968
*The District of North Wiltshire (Footpath No. 18
Chippenham) Public Path Diversion Order 1977*

Notice is hereby given that on 25th April 1977 the North Wiltshire District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed without modification is to divert a length of the public right of way known as footpath No. 18 in the former municipal borough of Chippenham as described below:

That length of footpath No. 18 which runs from a point beginning at Wood Lane running from north to south for a distance of approximately 320 metres shall be diverted to run from a point beginning at Wood Lane south-westerly for a distance of approximately 82 metres turning south-easterly for a distance of approximately 274 metres.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the North Wiltshire District Council, Monkton Park, Chippenham and may be inspected during the hours of 9 am and 1 pm and 2 pm and 5 pm Mondays to Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from 11th July 1977 but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959 as amended or on the ground that any requirement of the Act as amended or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may under Paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by Paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act within 6 weeks from the 30th May 1977 make an application for the purpose to the High Court.—Dated 30th May 1977.

Brompton-by-Sawdon, Near Scarborough, Diversion
Order 1977*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on 29th April 1977 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment for confirmation as an opposed Order or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by North Yorkshire County Council.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to divert the public right of way commencing at point A (marked on the map) and running in a westerly direction for approximately 170 metres then turning in a northerly direction for approximately 86 metres to point B the new path commencing at point C and turning north towards the northern boundary of O.S. Field 166 to join the existing path at point B a total distance of approximately 270 metres.
